### PCC offers Real Estate course

"Real Estate Trends" is a five-session course being offered by Portland Community College that started November 8. Although open to the public, "Real Estate Trends" is specially designed to aid real estate salesmen in satisfying the new Oregon State requirement of 9 clock hours of real estate education for re-licensing.

Five topics, "Financing Real Estate Transactions", "Income Tax Aspects of Real Estate Investments", "Zoning and Ordinances", "Appraisal of Real Property", and "Title Insurance and Closing", will be offered at six different locations in the PCC area: Marshall High School, St. Helen's High School, Newberg High School; Lake Oswego High School; Cedar Park Intermediate School; and Hillsboro High School. Students may attend any three of the five sessions at any location to receive a certificate of completion. Attendance will be taken at each class.

Cost of the course is \$6 for any or all of the five sessions. Information about dates and times is available from real estate brokers in the PCC district or by calling Portland Community College, 244-6111. No text is required for the course. Each class will be a one-hour seminar conducted by state approved instructors. The new requirement must be satisfied annually. Plans to continue the real estate series each term.



### Muse speaks to NAACP Portland Branch

On Friday, November 12th, the Portland Branch, NAACP, will hold a special meeting at 7:30 pm with Mr. Edward B. Muse, Director of the Life Membership division of the national NAACP staff in New York City, as the speaker. The headquarters at 2752 N. Williams Avenue.

In an article published by Ebony Magazine, NAACP Life members were called the "Honor Guard of the NAACP".

Mr. Muse is responsible for coordination of the NAACP's Life Membership program in the organization's numerous branches throughout the nation. His background includes more than 25 years experience in social work and civil rights work as both a professional and a volunteer. Prior to joining the NAACP staff, Mr. Muse held an administrative position with the United Hias Service - the international Jewish migration agency. Before that, he was a research assistant at the Columbia

University Bureau of Applied Social Research, where he participated in studies on attitudes between racial, religious and ethnic groups.

As a volunteer, Mr. Muse has held high positions with the New York City Branch of the NAACP and was founder of the Greenwich Village-Chelsea Branch. He is a past president of the Greenwich Village - Chelsea Open Neighborhood Committee - an organization founded to combat racial and religious bias in the rental and sale of apartments. He is a former president of the Greenwich Village Brotherhood Committee.

A World War II veteran, Mr. Muse studied at Columbia University and received his BA and MA degrees in Sociology, and has studied toward his PhD, at New York School for Social Research.

The meeting is open to the public.

### Wilberforce to Train in Store Management

Dr. Rembert Stokes, president of Wilberforce University of Wilberforce, Ohio, the oldest Black institution of higher learning, and Mr. Thomas J. Conney, Employee-Public Relations Manager of the Southern Division of Safeway Stores Inc., in Los Angeles, jointly announced participation in a cooperative educational program to train Wilberforce students in major phases of food store management.

Beginning in the January semester, five Wilberforce students will spend 16 weeks of intensive training in all phases of super market management, wherein they alternate academic study at the University and practical work experience at Safeway. Dr. Stokes stated that "The internship program will offer our students an opportunity to learn first hand the intricate phases of store merchandising, display and promotion of the meat, grocery, produce, non-foods, and dairy departments."
