U.S. Supreme Court considers Oregon Law

The U.S. Supreme Court will consider Oregon's law that permits non-unanimous jury verdicts in criminal cases. Oregon allows an 11-1 or 10-2 verdict in all but first-degree murder cases. Oregon and Louisiana are the only states that do not require unanimous decisions.

The Supreme Court heard the case, Robert Apodaca vs. Oregon, a year ago but is asking for further arguments. Jacob Tanzer, administrator of the State Department of Human Resources, will defend the state in his former capacity as Oregon solicitor general. He argued the case when it was first heard by the Supreme Court.

Public defender, Gary Babcock will represent Apodaca and two other men who were convicted by non-unanimous verdicts. Babcock contends the non-unanimous jury verdicts violate the federal constitution.

More than 25 Oregon penitentiary inmates will be entitled to new trials if the law is overturned by the federal courts.

Wicks sparks clinic

Wicks NBA choice

Sidney Wicks, top draft choice of the Portland Trail Blazers for UCLA, will be the only rookie participating in the National Basketball Association's All Star game January 18 in Los Angeles.

Wicks, a 6-9 forward averaging 24.2 points a game, was selected by a vote of coaches to the NBA Western team. Wicks scored 1,087 points in his first 45 games - a pace which over a full season would mean 1,981 points, just 19 short of being the eighth rookie in NBA history to hit the 2,000 mark.

The seventh was Geoffrey Petrie with the Blazers last season.

The big key to Wicks' success, however, has been improvement.

His scoring average has been fairly constant. But in his first 23 games, he averaged 4.1 assists a contest. In his next 22 clashes, this average was up to 4.9.

And his rebounding average jumped from 9.5 a game for his first 23 games to 13.2 for his next 22 contests.

In his first meetings with each NBA opponent this season, Wicks did well for a rookie -- 22.8 points, 8.9 rebounds and 3.7 assists a game.

The big story was what happened the second, third, fourth and fifth times he faced each foe -- after once around the league.

After his first games, he averaged 24.9 points, 13 rebounds and 5.2 assists in his first campaign in the NBA.

That record would put him close to top 10 ranking in scoring, rebounding and play-making.
