Don Foreman carries the ball

Don Foreman, 3220 N.E. Almsworth, a communications consultant for Pacific Northwest Bell, is some kind of competitor.

His determination to succeed that carries into his job of handling customers with complex phone arrangements for businesses, was evident as early as 1949.

He was a senior at Lincoln High School in Portland. He measured all of 5 feet and 6 inches; weighed in at 147 pounds and was the first string

fullback for the Lincoln Cardinals of the Portland Interscholastic League.

Press clipping show he made the second-team All-City backfield, as was voted "most inspirational" player and best defensive back by his teammates.

But Don didn't leave his determination at Lincoln. He was one of 27 Portland area high school stars selected for the 1950 Shrine All-Star team.

And in the third quarter of

that tight, defensive game he scored the only touchdown to give the Portland squad an 8-0 upset win over the highly favored State All-Stars.

After graduation, Foreman hoped to continue his education and football career at the University of Portland. But the Pilot football program folded.

However, Don remained undaunted and shifted his sights to Klamath Falls and Oregon Technical Institute.

By the end of his three-year varsity career on the mile high campus, Foreman was a leading ground gainer for the OTI Owls. He was an all-conference offensive and defensive selection and a Little All-American candidate.

Don is also active in the community. He is a board member of the Portland Sickle Cell Anemia Foundation and of Catholic charities. He is a member of the PNB Northeast Portland Community Relations Team, and is 1st vice-president of the Sertoma Club.

Topping it all off, he has continued his sports interests by coaching CYO Catholic basketball and baseball teams. He has also served as CYO athletic director at Holy Redeemer Parish on North Portland Boulevard.

Adding it all up, some 20 years after leaving the football field, he's still "some kind of a competitor."

Coretta King endorses Senator McGovern

Coretta Scott King, widow of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., announced her endorsement of Senator George McGovern for President of the United States in a joint appearance with Senator McGovern at the Second Baptist Church in Los Angeles:

I am pleased to be here in California to endorse Senator George McGovern's candidacy for the Presidency of the United States.

I believe that Senator McGovern will bring an end to the era of division in our nation and will usher in a new era of reconciliation.

I believe Senator McGovern can provide the moral leadership that will coalesce the forces of goodwill in the nation that will create the conditions that will transform my husband's dream into a living reality.

At this time, I would like to take these next few minutes to outline the reasons why I began to listen carefully to what the Senator has had to say and also to share with you the position we have arrived at jointly which ultimately led me to make this endorsement.

First of all, the McGovern campaign has, from the beginning, struck themes which have paralleled my own views and those causes to which my husband gave his life force; compassion and equality for the poor, the disenfranchised, the Black, the Chicano, and the native Americans; the articulation of a dream of a unified America in which everyone, Black, White, Brown and Red alike have the opportunity to enjoy the fruits of their labors in dignity and equality; abhorrence of war; and the investment of a far larger share of America's wealth in the welfare of her people and the fabric of her society rather than on the excessive and continuous stockpiling and use of the weapons of death and destruction.

Moreover, many of the stands Senator McGovern has already taken and the positions we have arrived at jointly have many points of conjunction with the developing Black political thought, as expressed at the Gary convention and in the developmental work on the National Black Political Agenda which has been done since the convention.

Some of the specific points of the McGovern Program which led me to listen carefully to what the Senator had to say are the following:

1.) On taxation and the economy, George McGovern has promised to affect a redistribution of the wealth in this country by closing the tax loopholes which benefit the rich and by requiring American industry to bear its fair

share of the tax burden to the relief of poor and middle income groups suffering from high tax rates and inflation. The Senator also plans a program of full employment for all by substantially increasing the nation's housing efforts and by expanding public service employment. This is of particularly striking importance to Black Vietnam veterans and to youngsters between the ages of 16 and 25, whose life chances are sharply diminished by the lack of job opportunities for them.

2.) George McGovern was the first and has been the most consistent opponent of the Indochina war in the United States Senate. I know how lonely and difficult such opposition could be back in the 60's because I watched the attempts to isolate and vilify my husband because of his opposition to this cruel and wasteful war.

3.) There has never been any real question as to where the Senator has stood on the question of equal rights for women. His position has been strong and consistent in opposing all forms of sex discrimination. He has pledged to by-pass by far, in his administration, any goals that smack of tokenism and to appoint women to all levels of government including the Supreme Court, the Cabinet, National Security Council, and the United Nations.

4.) And finally, the Senator recognizes that heroin is a particularly murderous problem in Black and Brown communities throughout the United States and he has vowed to increase vastly the federal funds available to attack this problem and to mount a forceful five pronged attack on it.

In the discussions I have had with Senator McGovern, I have drawn heavily on the collective Black political wisdom which was expressed in the Gary convention and in the subsequent developmental efforts which have occurred in its aftermath. We have come to agreement on a number of issues which reflect that thinking and my own. I shall merely mention two or three of the most important areas this morning.

1.) I believe, and the Senator agrees, that this nation must develop a new urban and rural land use policy which recognizes the yearnings of minority group members to own the homes in which they live and the land upon which they work. To this end, Senator McGovern and his staff have agreed to work out a new program to provide free interest and low interest loans to low income persons for the acquisition of property in both rural and urban areas. They have also agreed to develop a policy requiring that the steadily increasing acreage of land

owned by the federal government - to the extent that it is passed back into private hands - will be made available for the purposes of this new program rather than putting it into the hands of private for-profit land speculators.

2.) The problems of employment and education are inextricably linked. As I have already noted, Senator McGovern has developed a program for full employment, but I do not want to leave the employment opportunities of young Blacks just entering the job market to chance or to consign them forever to the lowest rungs on the employment ladder, nor does the Senator. And, we have also agreed that the minority veterans deserve special attention in this connection. To that end, the Senator and I have agreed that a substantial proportion of his \$15 to \$24 billion annual educational program will be specifically targeted at providing quality education for minority and poor youth, that he will use the executive powers to the fullest to implement the 14th Amendment in educational matters and that specific manpower training and job counseling services will be targeted on the needs of returning minority veterans who need such services to enter the labor market with dignity and with hope. Moreover, George McGovern has pledged to increase federal aid to Black institutions of higher education by 20 per cent over the amount now being expended by the federal government.

3.) At my urging and that of my friend and colleague, Congressman Walter E. Fauntroy, Senator McGovern has generally endorsed the Washington Agenda developed by the delegation to the Democratic National Convention from the District of Columbia. First and foremost, this Agenda provides for self-determination for the residents of the Nation's Capital and for the end of colonial rule of that city.

4.) And in the field of foreign policy, the Senator has agreed to end, if elected, the provision of the materials of war to dictatorships such as Brazil, Greece, Portugal, and other such nations which have been using those materials to repress the legitimate and full human aspirations of the people, including those under colonial rule for freedom and

self-government. In addition, Senator McGovern agrees to reverse the policies of this government which give aid and comfort to the repressive regimes of South Africa and Rhodesia, which seem determined to deny in perpetuity the full human rights of our Black sisters and brothers living in those nations.

Thus, in view of the positions he has taken and the mutual understandings we have reached, it is clear to me that Senator McGovern's concern and regard for the dignity and the rights of poor and oppressed people everywhere - his interest in the common man, be he White, Red, Brown, or Black - far exceeds that of any other candidate - Republican or Democratic - now in the field. For those reasons, then, and for his integrity as a human being and a political man, I am proud to endorse George McGovern's candidacy for the Presidency.

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
