It's Your Navy

Did you know that: Six members of the "New Navy" Little League team, sponsored by Navy Recruiting, are members of the Northeast League team which went to the district playoffs in The Dalles. Navy counselors John Brown and Tom Farrar, who organized the sponsorship of the team, accompanied them to Albany with "Commodore", the Navy goat who is the team mascot.

Now for this week's question - "What is the Navy doing to protect the environment?" asks John W. John. In addition to establishing the Naval Civil Engineering Laboratory in San Diego and pollution control agencies at its larger bases, the Navy is educating its personnel in environmental protection. Deputy Undersecretary of the Navy, Joseph Grimes, said in Boston, July 20th, "The Navy is playing a leadership role in the protection of our environment. We have spent more than any other federal agency in cleaning up our own pollution problems." Speaking at the Boston shipyard, launching one of the Navy's new oil skimmers, Undersecretary Grimes noted that the job of environmental protection must be a cooperative effort by federal, state and local governments, and by private environmental groups. Grimes said the Navy will spend close to \$150 million on ship discharge problems in fiscal year 1973, and nearly one million dollars on oil clean-up equipment, if Congress approves the proposed budget. Oil booms to contain spills have been purchased for more than thirty activities from Rota, Spain to Guam. The budget for clean-up equipment will increase substantially if advances, like the new oil skimmer, prove effective and reliable. Grimes said the Navy is convinced its efforts are good investment, good for the Navy, the country and the environment.

The oil skimmer is a unique Navy workboat for cleaning up oil spills from the water. It was launched July 20th at the U.S. Naval Shipyard, Boston, at a ceremony featuring an address by Navy Deputy Undersecretary, Joseph Grimes. The boat is the first operational unit of its kind, and is designed for use in harbors and near shore areas. By confining the oil below the boat using vertical plates, the skimmer workboat can harvest up to 22-hundred gallons of oil per hour at a speed of 2 knots. It operates anywhere from 0 to 3 knots while collecting oil, and can perform effectively in waves up to 2 feet. The 25-foot, 2-man boat pumps the collected oil into onboard storage tanks.
