

to thwart Black employment since we quit "pickin' cotton for a roof and a little food." It gives minorities a toe in the door. And for a change, it is the front door. And beyond that it enables minorities, with some hard pushing from Goldschmidt and this community to vie for positions within the entire City Civil Service System. And to punctuate the whole promise of this, with an exclamation of "A Noble Proposal", is that if the city goes for it, why not the County Commissioners and the Governor.

Goldschmidt has taken his stand openly in having Ron Buel present the proposal. The citizens at the meeting accepted all of it with the exception of that dealing with "special knowledge of the target areas being served by the programs." A special Task Force of Neighborhood Citizens is making a study of what they want which essentially concerns itself to how long a person must reside in the target areas. This "special knowledge" issue

when resolved by citizens will be added later, Buel promised.

We know where Goldschmidt is coming from and we support his efforts. We praise him for taking such action so promptly after the primary election. What we need to know now is how do the other Commissioners and the Mayor stand. We are to find out soon, as Buel stated he hoped to get the proposal before the City Council at the "earliest date possible."

And of course we need to know where the County Commissioners stand. Or do they prefer the accepted position of sitting? Governor Tom McCall has yet to impress us with his implementation of Oregon's State Affirmative Action Plan being so fearfully managed by Mr. Underhill.

Goldschmidt has given us a glimmer of hope. It is literally a candle being lit instead of cursing the darkness. Goldschmidt has shown he intends to keep his promises.
