

Book opposes apartheid

The Right To Say No by Judith Todd (Third Press, Viking dist. \$6.95) tells for the first time the truth behind Rhodesia's anti-colonial struggle. The Right To Say No is not only the story of these times, but also an indictment of the policy of appeasement Great Britain had toward Rhodesia; the culmination of which were the Settlement Proposals - massively rejected by the

Africans - under which all power was to be left in the hands of the illegal Ian Smith regime. Judith Todd, the twenty-nine-year old daughter of the former Rhodesian Prime Minister, Garfield Todd, reveals not only life under the Smith regime, but also the details of the proposals worked out by Britain and the team of negotiators led by Lord Goodman with Ian

Smith, and without the participation of the African majority. She also criticizes the U.S. Government's decision to continue the importation of Rhodesian chrome despite a United Nations embargo on trade with Rhodesia.

This personal account of the imprisonment of Judith Todd and her father for five weeks, without trial and without having been accused of any crime, is also the story of a country's struggle for freedom and sane government.

Judith Todd now lives in London, where her book is on the best seller list. She continues her battle against the current Rhodesian regime that still has her father under house arrest. Because of her stand for the people she was recently appointed delegate to the United Nations for the African National Congress.

Western produces film

Western Airlines has completed production of a 25 minute color-sound 16mm travel film titled "Holiday in Acapulco". The film highlights two prominent Black group tour movements to the Mexican resort.

The groups involved are Golden State Mutual Life Insurance Company of Los Angeles' Seventh Annual Leaders Roundtable sales incentive tour, and West Adams Community Hospital's Gold Tour and Fun-O-Rama. Former Dodger pitching ace Don Newcombe and ex-Green Bay Packers All-Pro Willie Davis, co-hosted the latter movement.

The Acapulco Hilton Hotel was headquarters for the insurance company's 184 delegates and families, while the Acapulco Princess hosted the 65-member hospital group. Western Airlines was the principal carrier for both tours.

An all-Black camera crew headed by Howard Morehead, former Ebony Magazine, movie and KTLA-TV cameraman spent two weeks in Acapulco shooting the film. Ralph Cushman, veteran Hollywood technician is film editor. Larry McCormick, KTLA newsman, does a notable job as narrator. The narration was written by
