Over 500,000 signatures in favor of government support for OIC (Opportunities Industrialization Centers) were expected to be presented to President Nixon by this week.
Dr. Leon Sullivan, founder of the manpower training organization, announced that the petitions would be presented to the President and Congress during a national OIC pilgrimage to be held on the grounds of the Capitol.
Nixon administration proposals to cut back federal funding for OIC and channel all manpower money through city governments under revenue sharing have made the demonstration and petition necessary, OIC spokesmen said.
Dr. Sullivan warned that many OIC programs could become patronage tools for mayors or be eliminated altogether under the new plan.
OIC, which has programs in 110 cities, is the largest non-profit minority manpower training and placement organization in the country. Over 150,000 minority workers, mostly Black have been trained and placed into jobs in its eight year existence.
