## Choir plans concert

An enjoyable evening is in store for lovers of fine music when the Portland Symphonic Choir presents its Spring Concert Monday, April 30 in the Civic Auditorium. The program will open with the Gloria in G Major by Poulenc, for soprano and chorus. This work was commissioned by the Koussevitzky Foundation of the Library of Congress and was premiered in Boston on January 20, 1961.

Stabat Mater by Rossini will complete the program. This work for solo quartet and chorus is considered to be Rossini's greatest work outside of his operatic compositions. It was composed because of a request made through a very special friend to whom Rossini was obligated.

Soloists for the program will be Joyce Peters, soprano; Frances Arnold, mezzo-soprano; Joseph Gilmore, tenor and Arthur Kayser, bass. All the soloists have made many appearances on the concert stage in the Portland area.

## COMMUNITY CALENDAR

Former students of Vanport Extension Center will observe the 25th anniversary of the flooding of Vanport on Memorial Day, 1948, with a reunion at Portland's Memorial Coliseum on Saturday, June 16, 1973, 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Vanport, the metropolitan area's first public college, became known as "The College That Would Not Die" after the 1948 flood, and has since grown to be Portland State University.

Students of the 1946-50 years are organizing the reunion with the help of John Jenkins, PSU Alumni Office Director and an original Vanport faculty member. Ex-students who may attend are asked to notify Jenkins at P.O. Box 751, Portland, 97207. A head count is desirable, says Jenkins.

Dr. Stephen Epler, first Director of Vanport Extension Center, and the founder of public higher education in Portland, plans to attend. Dr. Epler is now President

of Ohlone Community College in Fremont, California. Other early faculty members are being contacted, including a number who are still on the staff at Portland State.

Anyone who was a student at Vanport Extension Center from 1946 to 1950 is urged to attend the reunion. The planning committee needs help in locating people, notes Jenkins, and asks "old-timers" to spread the word.

Food and beverages will be available at the Coliseum on a no-host basis.



Applications are being accepted to establish a register from which mail handler, clerk and carrier vacancies for the Post Office will be filled.  
No experience is required. All applicants are required to take a written examination and a physical examination.  
Mail handlers load, unload and handle bulk mail and perform duties incidental to the movement and processing of mail.  
Clerks sort and distribute mail, work at windows selling stamps, and do other inside jobs. Carriers collect and deliver mail, either walking or driving.  
All qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, national origin, sex, political affiliation, or any other non-merit factor.  
Salary for substitute mail handlers is from \$3.96 to \$5.15 per hour. Salary for regular mail handlers is from \$7956 per year to \$10,354 per year. Salary for substitute clerks and carriers is \$4.22 to \$5.51 per hour. Regular clerks and carriers receive \$8488 to \$11,073 per year.  
Applications must be submitted before May 4, 1973.
