(Continued from pg. 1, col. 8) human dignity for his spirit." Dates such as December 10, 1964, the day he received the Nobel Peace Prize, are also displayed.

Mr. Tarr says the huge, cube-shaped piece is made from 60 tons of Bethlehem Steel's weathering steel in the form of quarter-inch plates welded to a framework of heavy angles.

"Because of the immensity of the piece," Mr. Tarr says, "it was necessary to fabricate the letters in my Manhattan studio, position the lettering and join the plate sections in a Brooklyn steel fabricating plant and assemble the sculpture at the school site."

"I chose weathering steel because of its color and texture, and because it will require almost no maintenance. The school's exterior will also be weathering steel."

"To assure a uniformity of color, I've set the steel outdoors for as long as six months. As it weathers, it will take on a rich purple-brown tone. I'm using special welding rods so that the weldment will also match the steel's color."

"Letters smaller than 11 inches are hand-burned from two-inch-thick steel plates. Larger letters - some of them are 30 inches high and 4 inches deep - are fabricated."

When the cube's five sides were completed, they were trucked, in sections, from the plant to the school site and unloaded with a crane. Each side weighs about 24,000 pounds. The crane placed the plates in approximate position and Mr. Tarr aligned them with jacks. The plates were welded at the cube's corners.

Besides being a work of art, the piece will be functional. It will serve as an exhaust vent for the school's air conditioning system.

"I have about two months more work," Mr. Tarr says. "This piece has been a lot of labor - God knows how much welding. But, I think it will be worth it."

The sculpture is expected to be completely assembled by July 1, well before the new high school is completed.

Now under construction, the school is at 66th Street and Amsterdam Avenue and adjoins the Lincoln Center. Mr. Tarr says the piece will bear quotations from Dr. King and important dates in his life. of the Fourteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

Additional claims are made that continued imprisonment, based in part on the grounds that Slopak needs further treatment, constitutes cruel and unusual punishment because there is no treatment available to him at the penitentiary. The decision is also said to be arbitrary and capricious in the absence of explicit standards and criteria for release.

Slopak is serving a sentence of up to 15 years as a result of being convicted in 1969 of sodomy by the Circuit Court of Multnomah County.
