YSOL robbed of equipment

On June 14th, between the tiptoeing hours of 1:00 and 9:00 in the morning, a very particular burglar entered the offices of YSOL Radio, 2723 N.E. 7th.

Oliver O'Farrell, director of the struggling, independent, community-oriented radio station, said Friday June 14, "He (the burglar) was very selective. He knew exactly what he wanted and that's all he took."

Apparently the thief had been in the office before the closing time of 1:00 a.m., had shut off the burglar alarm and unlocked the back window. When the YSOL offices were closed down for the night, the thief returned with transportation and some apparent help.

He stole one turntable, one cassette recorder, an open reel tape deck, sixty 45-rpm records (all the latest), sixty albums (all the latest), three speakers, and two receivers. Some of the equipment belonged to employees of YSOL who had loaned it to the station until it was able to supply it's own.

The loss is estimated at approximately \$2,000. The rule that no visitors will be allowed in the offices after 5:30 will now be strictly enforced, and the back window will be boarded-up permanently.

YSOL, already crippled by a shortage of funds, has been



Oliver O'Farrell, YSOL Director, explains how the break-in was planned.

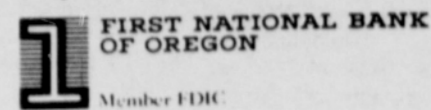
badly hurt by this "un-brotherly" deed. However, as an *Observer* reporter interviewed Oliver O'Farrell Friday morning after the

Washington bars sex discrimination

House Bill 404 became effective in the State of Washington on June 7, 1973. This is a bill relating to the Laws against Discrimination.

Basically, discrimination has been a matter of state concern since the early passage of laws covering race, color, creed, national origin and age. In 1971 the legislature amended the law to include non-discrimination in employment on the basis of sex. Now in 1973 discrimination on the basis of marital status has been declared unlawful by the lawmakers as they recently amended the Law. Marital status covers employment, credit and insurance transactions and real property transactions.

In Employment - Employers cannot refuse to hire an applicant because a spouse works for the same company.

In Housing - It is now an unfair practice to discriminate in the course of negotiating, executing or financing a real estate transaction whether by mortgage, deed or trust, contract or other instrument imposing a lien or other security of real property or in negotiating or executing any item or service related thereto including issuance of title insurance, mortgage insurance, loan guarantee, or other aspects of the transaction. In housing this means that the average citizen in the market for a rental, lease or purchase of real property, which includes apartments, etc., cannot be refused on the basis of marital status.

In Credit Transactions - Credit cannot be refused based on marital status.

In Insurance - It is an unfair practice under the Washington State Law Against Discrimination for ANY person, whether acting for himself (herself) or another, in connection with an insurance transaction to fail or refuse to issue or renew insurance to any person because of sex, marital status, race, creed, color or national origin.

Application for Credit - It is an unfair practice to use or require designation of the sex, race, creed, color or national origin of any person on ANY document concerning an application for credit in any credit transaction.

New to the Law Against Discrimination is an addition which makes it possible for any person who deems that he has been injured by any act in violation of the Law Against Discrimination to have recourse through civil action in the courts to enjoin such respondents from further violations and to recover the actual damages sustained by him or her together with the cost of suit, including a reasonable attorney's fee, or any other remedy authorized by the Law Against Discrimination or the U.S. Civil Rights Action of 1964.

OES teaches sports

Due to public demand, the basketball-soccer clinic being offered by Oregon Episcopal Schools this summer has expanded its program. There now will be three soccer clinics offered, with starting dates scheduled for July 9, 16, and 23. Each clinic will run for four days, and the fundamentals of ball handling, dribbling, and offense tactics will be stressed. Also, rules and good sportsmanship will be stressed daily. Heading the soccer clinic will be John Hicks, varsity soccer coach at Bishop Dagwell Hall for the past five years. Hicks has led his teams to the State Finals four times.

Both the basketball and soccer clinics will be open to boys between the ages of nine and fourteen. The cost for each session will be \$20 and both morning and afternoon session hours are available.

The basketball clinic will stress ball handling, shooting, dribbling and passing. At the end of each day there will be team competition at each grade level. Gary Craigmiles, athletic director and varsity basketball coach at Dagwell for eight years, will direct this clinic.

Also, if coaches are interested, teams can be accommodated at the clinic, and a special discount is available. The clinic directors will also work on an individual basis with coaches.

The basketball-soccer clinic at OES is the only combined clinic of its kind being offered in the metropolitan Portland area this summer.

All equipment for the clinic will be furnished except for shoes, shorts and shirts. And, the fees will include medical insurance for each participant.
