The first greater Northwest appearance will be at the Maranatha Church, 1222 N.E. Skidmore on Friday, July 6th at 8:00 p.m. There have been enthusiastic reports from those of musical renown. Portland YWCA offers Shakespearean tours

The Portland YWCA is offering two tours to the Oregon Shakespearean Festival at Ashland this summer. Lectures on the plays to be seen will be given at the YWCA prior to each tour.

The Shakespeare Economy Tour from June 29 through July 1 will have lodging and meals at Southern Oregon College at Ashland, and will see "Othello", "As You Like It" and "Merry Wives of Windsor", with a tour backstage scheduled. Escorts will be Dorothy Neelan and Jane Cook, and tour members will be given a choice of return by Crater Lake or the new Wildlife Safari near Roseburg.

The tour August 17-19 will include both the Shakespearean and the Peter Britt Festivals. Tour members will see "Othello", "Merry Wives of Windsor" and "Henry V" at Ashland, and will visit Jacksonville and attend the Festival Orchestral Concert in the Peter Britt Garden Pavilion, conducted by John Trudeau, festival founder. Lannie Hurst will be the escort. The tour will include stops at historical sites en route, hotel lodging and some meals.

The lecture on the three plays to be seen June 29 through July 1 will be given June 27 at 7:30 p.m. by John Cooper, PSU English Professor in the YWCA Wilson Center. Caucus Time

The Model Cities employees, displaced because of the phase-out, must be absorbed by the city. It's about time that we ask City Hall to stop speaking with a forked tongue. Proposals come out of the various agencies and the Mayor's "office" glowing with verbiage about how the people come first. We recognize that proposals for federal dollars have to read that way: No liberal, noble and "I'm my brothers keeper" statements, no federal money. The problem is that after the money is in the city, liberalism becomes conservative, nobility becomes tarnished and brothers forget their Christian ideals.

There are two basic points that must be amplified in the situation concerning Model Cities employees who are to be phased out of employment. One is the question of qualifications. The question we must ask is whether passing out leaflets for a political candidate is an experience more qualifying for working in social programs and programming than working in a social program and gaining valuable expertise. The second point is also qualifications. Do we try to fit the Model Cities' employees into the City Civil Service system or do we make the City Civil Service system fit the people of Model Cities? There is a very basic difference. If the City Civil Service system is inadequate for classifying the skills of needed areas of expertise, then those persons with those skills can be hired outside of that system. The Model Cities' employees must not be punished for the inadequacy of a system long overdue for an overhaul or the shenanigans of those using the system as a tool of exclusion.

If the Model Cities' employees are not phased into the many social and other programs that the city is proposing, then it's because the field is too crowded with those who gained their experience for working with

people, by passing out political leaflets.

Cronyism cannot be accepted by any organization of this city if such action serves to deny deserving citizens an opportunity for employment. There can be no backroom,

under-the-table or federal fund buy-offs of any organization in the Model Cities neighborhood where jobs and people are concerned. Be ye Christian or otherwise, no organization is too old to learn that new trick.

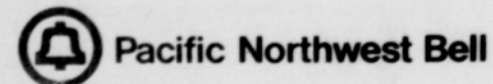
