PSU gets grant

Portland State University has received grants totaling \$101,113 from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare's Bureau of Education for the Handicapped to provide continued support for programs in special education and speech and hearing sciences that prepare professionals to work with the handicapped.

The special education department will receive \$80,100 of the total and the speech pathology and audiology programs in the speech department will receive \$21,013. The funds are the second half of a two-year HEW grant totaling \$217,613. This is the eighth year the programs have been funded through grants.

PSU has more than 400 students receiving training in PSU clinics, as well as in schools and other public agencies in the metropolitan area for work with the handicapped.
