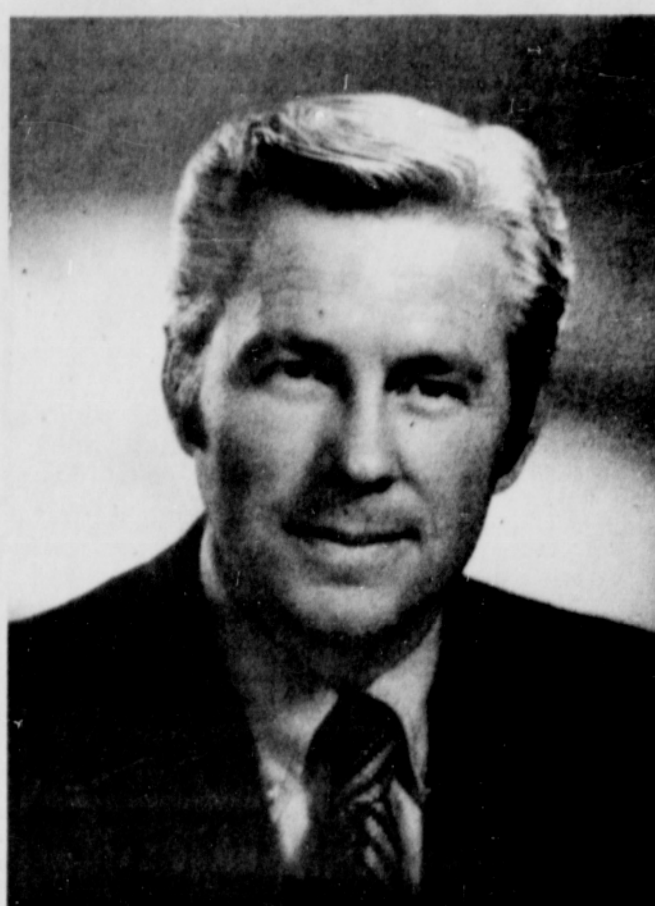

Emanuel prexy chosen

"wholesale, not piecemeal". He discussed the earlier commitments made by the Mayor and Commissioners. He asked Miss Schwab and Block to be advocates for the people of Model Cities at city hall. He discussed the fact that Blacks are eliminated by employment interviews, which are based on personality and appearance, and that this could all be eliminated if the Bureau chose to live up to its commitments.

The complaints about PDC housing rehabilitation were discussed. Ella Mae Gay, who received a rehabilitation grant from Portland Development Commission, said she has been complaining since before the work was completed, but has received no satisfaction. Mrs. Schwab's office has been looking into the complaints. At a meeting of PDC, the Albina Contractors Association, her office and the Mayor's office, PDC had agreed to write new complaint procedures. The new procedures were received by Miss Schwab's office on this date.

The residents were also concerned about the structure of the Human Resources Bureau and the neighborhood planning areas. Nine areas will be developed, including Model Cities, each with a planning coordinator and access to the city department with which a problem arises. The Human Resources Bureau will have a citizen advisory committee, but is responsible to the city council.

Sister joins CUE

Stephen Schneider, Director of the Center for Urban Education, announced the appointment of Sister Karen Gosser, S.H.C.J., to the program staff of the Center. Her responsibilities include coordination of programs in alternative education, criminal justice and urban awareness.

Sister Karen is a Sister of the Holy Child Order, receiving her religious formation at the Provincial House in Pasadena, California. She has studied at Immaculate Heart College, Pasadena City College, and Portland State University, from which she received her BS. In Southern California, Sister Karen was involved in Special Education programs for mentally and physically handicapped children, tutorial projects and religious education work. Previous to joining the CUE staff, Sister Karen taught Biology and Chemistry at Holy Child Academy here in Portland. In addition to her responsibilities with CUE, she will be involved with several other sisters in beginning a House of Prayer.

The Center for Urban Education is an agency of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon (successor to the Greater Portland Council of Churches and the Oregon Council of

Churches). The Center currently focuses its activities around five priority areas: land use planning, human services, cable television, criminal justice and alternative education. In these areas the Center continues an integrated program of research, educational events and media productions. CUE also includes the activities of the NEW Theatre and the Portland New Communicators project. Upon request the Center designs learning experiences to meet special needs of religious, community service and social action groups in the city.

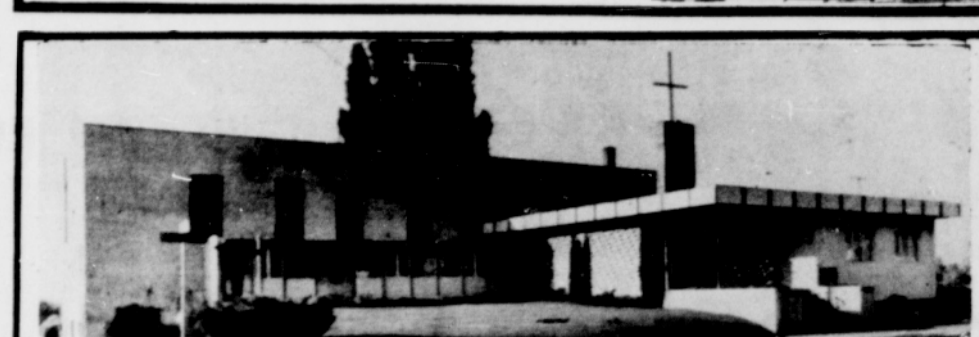
