

Reverend Barry L. Hopkins will be the evangelist for Mt. Olivet Baptist Church's Annual Evangelistic Services.

He presently serves in the positions of Secretary for Africa and Special Services for the BIM. His responsibilities include coordination of the work of 88 American Baptist missionaries in Zaire and relationships with the Baptist Church of Western Zaire.

A native of Connecticut, Hopkins received the A.B. degree in sociology and the Master of Divinity degree from Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia. At the age of 25, Reverend Hopkins was called to pastor the Sixth Mount Zion Church. While in Richmond he served as Second Vice President of the Richmond Clergy Association,

consultant to the Richmond Urban League in the area of urban problems and advisor to the State of Virginia, office of the Southern Baptist Convention in Urban Ministries. Reverend Hopkins' interests included serving with Trust, a human resources agency, as one of their human dynamic trainers. In early 1969 he founded, with other local ministers, the Richmond Committee of Black Churchmen, a local Black ecumenical council of ministers.

He is married to the former Elberta Fennell and has one son.

Services will be on Sunday, October 6th, through Friday, October 11th. The Sunday service will be held at 11:00 a.m. and evening services at 7:00 p.m.
