Sweet Potatoes are one of several truly native Amer ican vegetables, along with corn, pumpkins, squash and new varieties of beans and peas. These crops supple-mented the familiar foods the colonists brought with them from England. As with corn, the Indians were cultivating sweet potatoes long before the arrival of the first settlers, and later taught them the value of this versatile crop. Yam is another name for

the sweet potato, especially in some parts of the South. where it is a staple food Actually the two vegetables belong to different plant families. However, they are so hard to tell apart that yams and sweet potatoes are interchangeable in any




