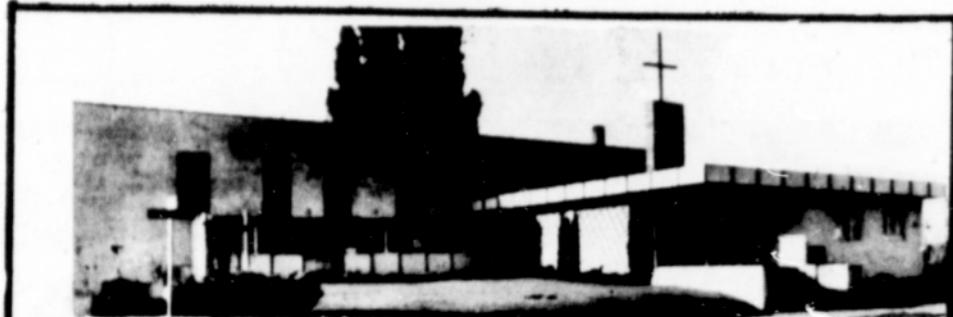

Vietnam benefit features singer

Malvina Reynolds, 73 year-old songwriter and singer, will appear at the Portland State University Ballroom, 8:00 p.m., Friday, April 25, 1975, in a benefit concert for the Notebooks for North Vietnam Project. The project is sponsored by the American Friends Service committee as part of the humanitarian reconstruction assistance being sent to all parts of Vietnam. The concert itself is co-sponsored by the PSU Progressive Arts Board.

Malvina has been writing songs - both words and music - since the early '50's, and many of us are familiar with her compositions - "Little Boxes," "Turn Around," "Morningtown Ride," "Magic Penny" - through their performances by some of our leading singers: Judy Collins, Pete Seeger, Joan Baez, Harry Belafonte, The Seekers, The Limelights.

She had more good songs than were being picked up by other singers, so in her 50's Malvina took to the road and began singing her own, making successful appearances at concerts, college assemblies, festivals, and national conferences. She has also appeared, singing her own songs as the character Kate on Sesame Street. She has toured in Japan, in England, and in France. Many of her songs are topical, though she writes on any subject that inter-

ests her - love songs, children's songs, ballads, nowhere songs. The songs are available in printed form in four collections: **Little Boxes and Other Handmade Songs, The Muse of Parker Street, Tweedles and Foodies, Cheerful Tunes for Lutes and Spoons.**

Malvina composes and sings popular songs, and on her new records she performs in a rock setting that goes well with her music and ideas.

Catholic/Jew featured

For the first time in the history of the Lectureship a Jewish Christian dialogue will take place between two of the nation's foremost Biblical theologians.

Notice is hereby given that the City of Portland has filed a major modification with the U.S. Department of Labor for federal manpower funds available under Title VI of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973 (CETA).

The initial funding application was submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor on January 8th, 1975. This modification supercedes prior modifications.

This modification accepts \$125,246 in discretionary funds, increasing the total grant allocation from \$1,523,258 to a new total of \$1,648,504. This money will be used entirely for public service employment.

An estimated 288 individuals will be served over the next ten months and there will be 146 positions filled by the end of April, 1975.

Notice is hereby given that the City of Portland has filed two major modifications to the Comprehensive Manpower Plan with the U.S. Department of Labor for Federal Manpower funds available under Title I of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973 (CETA).

The initial funding application was submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor on June 1st, 1974.

The first major modification changed specific sections of the initial grant narrative and changed program activities.

From October 1st, 1974 through June 30th, 1975 approximately 1,493 economically disadvantaged persons will utilize the program's services with an estimated 840 persons completing the program by June 30th, 1975. Of those completing, 407 participants will be placed in unsubsidized permanent employment and 222 persons (primarily youth) will return to school or enroll in additional non-CETA training or activity. Those enrolled in the program will receive attention under CETA as follows: Black 424, Chicano 307, American Indian 153, other minorities 287, Vietnam era Veterans 264, Youth 665, Older Workers 100, and ex-offenders 64.

Anticipated expenditures by cost categories will be: Administration - \$563,000; Allowances - \$272,000; Client Wages - \$948,000; Fringe Benefits - \$71,000; and Services to Clients - \$480,000 for an estimated FY75 total of \$2,910,000.

Estimated costs of the Manpower System components for FY75 will be: Intake, Orientation and Assessment - \$231,552; Pre Vocational and Vocational Training - \$289,100; Job Development and Placement - \$75,398; Management Information System - \$114,969; Youth Manpower System - \$817,475; Older Workers Program - \$333,028; and CETA Administration - \$316,706. The second major modification increases the total grant funding from \$3,684,000 to \$3,919,050; \$1,009,350 of the new grant total has been obligated for the forthcoming fiscal year.
