

SECTION A INVITATION TO BID

Sealed bids for construction of the 5th and 6th Avenues Transit Mall, Portland, Oregon, will be received at the offices of Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met), 522 S.W. Yamhill Street, Portland, Oregon 97204, until 2:00 p.m. Local Time on January 14, 1976, and then at said offices publicly opened and read aloud.

Briefly the Work is described as follows:

1. The 5th and 6th Avenues Transit Mall is located in the central business district of Portland, Oregon. The limits of the work primarily include Southwest 5th and 6th Avenues from Southwest Madison Street on the South to West Burnside Street on the North and work on the cross streets adjacent thereto.

2. The work includes the construction of the transit mall including excavating, backfilling, structural revision to basement extensions of private property Owners, revisions to public and private utilities, protection of existing work, concrete construction, waterproofing, brickwork, granite work, street paving, tree grates, bus passenger shelters, special sidewalk furnishings, landscaping, fountains, mechanical work and electrical work. Also included in the work will be traffic signals and signing, fire alarm system, transit information equipment and graphics.

3. The project will be constructed under the direction of Tri-Met and Skidmore, Owings and Merrill Architects. The work will be performed under permits issued by the City Engineer and City Bureau of Buildings and traffic control will be subject to regulation by the City Bureau of Traffic Engineering.

For the project, lump sum bids will be received on forms provided by the Architect. For the project two complete sets of Drawings and Specifications may be ordered by prime bidders only from Campbell Copy Company, 511 N.W. Couch Street, Portland, Oregon 97209, phone (503) 227-3424, upon deposit of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per two sets. Prime bidders are defined as General Contractors. Additional sets or partial sets may be purchased for the cost of reproducing same.

Deposits made up procurement of Drawings and Specifications will be refunded upon return thereof in good condition to Campbell Copy Company by actual bidders within two weeks after opening of bids and to non-bidders if returned no later than one week prior to bid opening.

No refund will be made on full or partial sets purchased at the cost of reproduction, although these Drawings and Specifications remain the property of the Architect and shall be returned.

Drawings and Specifications may be examined at The Buildings Exchange Offices in Portland and Seattle (Seattle Construction Center); The Builders Plan Center in Portland; The Construction Data & News in Portland; and The Associated General Contractors Office in Portland.

All bidders shall comply with Chapter 279, Oregon Revised Statutes, relating to the pre-qualification of bidders and to the payment of wages which shall not be less than the prevailing rates specified in the Contract Documents. No bid will be considered unless it contains a statement that the provisions required by ORS 279.350 shall be included in the Contract. Price, fitness and quality being equal, preference shall be given to Oregon products. Bidders are warned to file pre-qualification statements at least 21 days prior to the scheduled closing time for filing bids. All bidders must prequalify for this project.

Pre-qualification Forms may be obtained from Skidmore, Owings and Merrill, Architects, 900 S.W. Fifth Avenue, Portland, Oregon 97204.

No bid will be considered unless fully completed in the manner provided in the INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS Section upon the Proposal Form provided by the Architect, and accompanied by a certified check or a bid bond executed in favor of The Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) in an amount not less than 10 percent of the total amount of the bid, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages should the bidder neglect or refuse to enter into a Contract and provide suitable bond for the faithful performance of the Work in the event the Contract is awarded to him.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive all informalities. Award of the Contract is contingent on completion of Federal Environmental Procedures and approval of Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) Capital Grant for construction.

The Contractor will be required to comply with all applicable Equal Employer Opportunity laws and regulations.

The Contractor will be subject to a financial assistance contract between the Owner and the U.S. Department of Transportation.

All bidders will be required to certify that they are not on the Controller General's list of ineligible contractors.

Liquidated damages are included in this project.

No bidder may withdraw his bid after the hour set for the opening thereof until after the lapse of sixty days from the bid opening.

Notice is hereby given that the City of Portland has filed a major modification with the U.S. Department of Labor for federal funds available under Title I of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973 (CETA).

The initial funding application was submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor on July 11, 1974.

This modification increases the grant allocation, changes program activity and changes specific sections of the grant narrative.

The total FY 76 grant allotment has been increased by \$48,786, increasing the FY 76 allotment from \$3,527,145 to a new total of \$3,575,931. The total amount of FY 75 and FY 76 funds available July 1, 1975 through June 30, 1976 is \$5,356,257 and anticipated expenditures by cost categories are: Administration - \$1,071,251; Allowances - \$800,000; Participant Wages - \$1,582,600; Fringe Benefits - \$177,589; Training - \$671,912; and Services - \$1,052,905.

Planned expenditures by program activities are: Classroom Training - \$1,687,837; On-the-Job Training - \$1,104,807; Work Experience - \$1,239,024; and Services to Participants - \$1,324,589.

From July 1, 1975 through June 30, 1976 the program will enroll approximately 4,415 individuals, of which 3,137 are new enrollments this year. Out of the total enrollment, 3,305 will leave the program as follows: Direct Placement - 491; Indirect Placement - 503; Obtained Employment - 217; Other Positive Termination - 748; and Non Positive Termination - 1,346.

Planned enrollment in program activity is: Classroom Training - 798; Vocational Education - 344; On-the-Job Training - 450 and Work Experience - 1,602. The Significant Segments for the program are: Black - 1,374; Spanish American - 101; American Indian - 75; Other Minorities - 347; Veteran - 788; Ex-Offender - 650; Youth - 1,549; and Older Worker - 444.

Question: Is there a new range of employer taxes to finance Unemployment Insurance for 1976?

Answer: Yes, House Bill 2194 passed by the 1975 Oregon Legislature changes the base on which employers pay the Unemployment Insurance tax from the present \$5,000 to an amount determined annually as eighty percent of the State's average annual covered wage. For calendar year 1976 this will provide a tax base of \$7,000 with an increase to \$8,000 expected for 1977.

The schedule of tax rates which now range from 0.8 percent to 3.2 percent depending on employer experience and amounts in the Unemployment Trust Fund, were raised to range from 1.2 percent to 4.0 percent. In 1976, rates from 2.6 percent to 4.0 percent will be in effect. The special extended benefit tax was repealed by the passage of H.B. 2194.
