JERRY SUN SHOW ***

The Ramada Inn, like so many other night clubs that offer live entertainment six nights a week, doesn't always have **GREAT** entertainment, but it's always good. The "Jerry Sun Show" closed out of the "Center 4" Lounge at the Ramada Saturday night. The five member group, consisting of two female vocalists, Debra Lee and Rhonda Oliver from London, England, were definitely an asset to the performance. One sang better than the other and one danced better than the other, so consequently they complimented each other. One unique thing about the ladies performance that I hadn't seen before is that they changed their outfits during their individual song and dance routines.

Mike January on drums and Ron Giles on piano were spotlighted only briefly during the show. They are both good musicians and play a variety of instruments, but should be given more time to show their abilities. The star of the show, Jerry Sun from the Philippines, "hogs" the spotlight a little too much, for me. Although he plays a variety of instruments pretty well there is much to be said for his singing ability.

They did such selections as "LeRoy Brown," "You Are The Sunshine of my Life," "Big Wheel Keep on Rolling," "Love Keeps Us Together," and many more. They also took the time to show some slides of a recent engagement at the Princess Hotel in Alcapulco, Mexico. Jerry Sun did the narration and the remainder of the group sang "Girl from Ipanema." A nice deviation from the norm and generally a nice performance from The Jerry Sun Show.

Movies aid Black school

The parent group of the Black Educational Center will present a film festival on Sunday the 28th of March. The festival will be the first major effort of the parents to raise funds for the center this year. The B.E.C., now in its fifth year of operation in the Albina community, has proven to be a successful alternative approach to the education of the children of that area. The center provides a curriculum which emphasizes the development of high competencies in self-discipline, basic skills, and a positive image of self-family-community and race. The center serves children from the ages of five through eight.

The children's parents provide support to the B.E.C. staff by assisting in the classrooms and conducting fund raising activities. Films to be viewed at the March 28th festival include:

"From These Roots," a film that explores the cultural, political and social forces that produced the explosion of talent and creativity in Harlem during

the 20's. The film features such greats as Duke Ellington, Langston Hughes and Josephine Baker.

"Blues Like Showers of Rain," with the voices and blues of blind Arvella Gray, Willie Thomas and Lighten Hopkins, this film is a skillful integration of sound and image, resulting in a unique portrait of the men and women whose life created the blues.

"Let the Church Say Amen," a film that describes the travels of a young Black minister fresh out of seminary as he travels in the Mississippi delta and as he accepts his first assignment at a church in Urban Chicago. This film combines the realism of a documentary with the flow and drama of the feature film.

The festival will be held at the Movie House, 1220 S.W. Taylor. Tickets are \$5 and can be purchased at the B.E.C. Bookstore on Williams and Beech or from the B.E.C. parents. Viewing will begin at 5:00 p.m.

Movie tells Watergate story

Three Oregon citizen action groups will stage a premier benefit of Warner Brothers' "All the President's Men" on April 8th at the Westgate theater.

This film version of the Watergate probe by **Washington Post** reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein, stars Robert Redford and Dustin Hoffman.

Oregon's premier is a benefit for the Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group (OSPIRG), the Oregon Environmental Council and the Oregon Consumer League. It also will benefit the national activities of Citizen Action Fund (CAF) a newly formed coalition of public interest groups.

At 2:30 in the morning of Saturday, June 17, 1972, five men broke into headquarters of the Democratic National Committee in Washington's Watergate Office Building. They were arrested in the act.

Bob Woodward, a young reporter on the payroll of the **Washington Post** for only nine months, and Carl Bernstein, a Post reporter since 1966, were assigned to the story. Soon their revelations were being printed worldwide and eventually proved a link to the White House. The book about their work on the story, "All the President's Men," sold 2,750,000 copies by the end of 1975 in several languages.

Ebony Fashion Show due April 9

The 18th Annual Ebony Fashion Fair will appear in Portland at the Civic Auditorium on April 9, 1976. This famed traveling fashion show is produced by Ebony magazine in Chicago and is sponsored here by the Portland Chapter of Links, Incorporated. The show here will benefit the Links Community Campship Fund for Disadvantaged Youths and Portland Urban League Education Fund.

The array of spectacular garments were personally selected by Mrs. Eunice W. Johnson, producer and director of the show, during her visits to the fashion centers of the world - Rome, Naples, Paris and London, as well as New York, Chicago and Los Angeles. The theme of this year's show is "The Natural Feeling."

Some of the famous designers whose garments will be featured in the show are Marc Bohan for Christian Dior, Balmain, St. Laurent, Ungaro, Guy Laroche, Karl Lagerfeld for Chlos and Calvin Klein. Mrs. Johnson has also selected outstanding creations from Black designers, Stephen Burrows, Jack Fuller for Nuance, James Daugherty, Scott Barrie for Barrie Sports and Willi Smith.

The traveling show consists of some 200 fashions complete with accessories, ten female models, two male models, a commentator, music director, stage and business managers and wardrobe staff.

Because of the unprecedented demand for sponsorship of the show from organizations in many, many cities throughout the United States, Ebony Fashion Fair will tour two seasons - the East from September 9th through December 14th, 1975 and the Southwest from January 15th through April 14th, 1976 - a total of 150 cities!

Mrs. Jeanne Scales and Mrs. Ocia Davis, co-chairperson of the benefit performance indicate ticket sales are going exceptionally well and expect an even larger attendance than at the December, 1974 show.
