AT HOME

Americans wake up every day to find their requests for credit denied. If you are denied credit and you do not know why, you have the right to find out the reason for a credit refusal and to know what your credit file contains.

A check on your credit file may turn up mistakes and inaccuracies. Other interesting data - like the time you refused to pay the entire bill of the carpenter who built the bookcase and never finished the job - may show on your file not as a dispute, but merely as an unpaid bill notation.

Under the Fair Credit Reporting Act of 1971, you must be given the name and address of the consumer agency that made the report derogatory to you. You then have the right to reply and to

challenge any incorrect or obsolete information. You have the right to see all of the information in your file and to know its source. You should also be told who has received credit reports on you in the previous six months.

You can dispute any derogatory information and request a re-investigation. If the investigation shows that the information was false, it will be removed from your file. If the investigation does not support your claims, you are still entitled to submit a brief statement stating your side of the issue and this statement will become a part of your file and will be included in any future reports that include the disputed account.

There will be no cost to you if you hold your interview within thirty days after being denied credit.

Class explores family decisions

Each one of us makes hundreds of decisions every day - some personal and others involving the whole family. "What time shall I go to bed?" "I'm going to have another piece of cake." "What shall we do about this report card?" "Maybe I should look for a better job." "Where shall we go on vacation?"

The Portland YMCA Family Services Department is presenting a four session course, "Family in Focus on Decisions," Tuesday evenings starting April 6th at St. Michael and All Angels Church, N.E. 43rd and Broadway. The instructor is Adrian B. Greek, Director of Family Life Education, who has had over five years of

helping parents understand ways to improve their effectiveness as they react to their children.

He states that the "Decisions" class will help each person clarify their goals and values they seek for themselves and their family. A series of simulation games will be used to develop skills for effective decision making - where to look for information, identifying alternatives, and their possible outcomes, and finally deciding to decide. The class will also cover ideas for increasing personal assertiveness and locating resources to increase "winning" decisions.
