Christ). In 1965, the St. Andrews congregation joined the Council of Community Churches. From September 1964 to September 1968, the congregation was housed in Norris Hall, after which it moved to its present location at 4800 N.E. 30th Avenue.

In January 1969, the St. Andrews Community Church became affiliated with the United Church of Christ and is now a member church of the Central Pacific Conference of that denomination.
