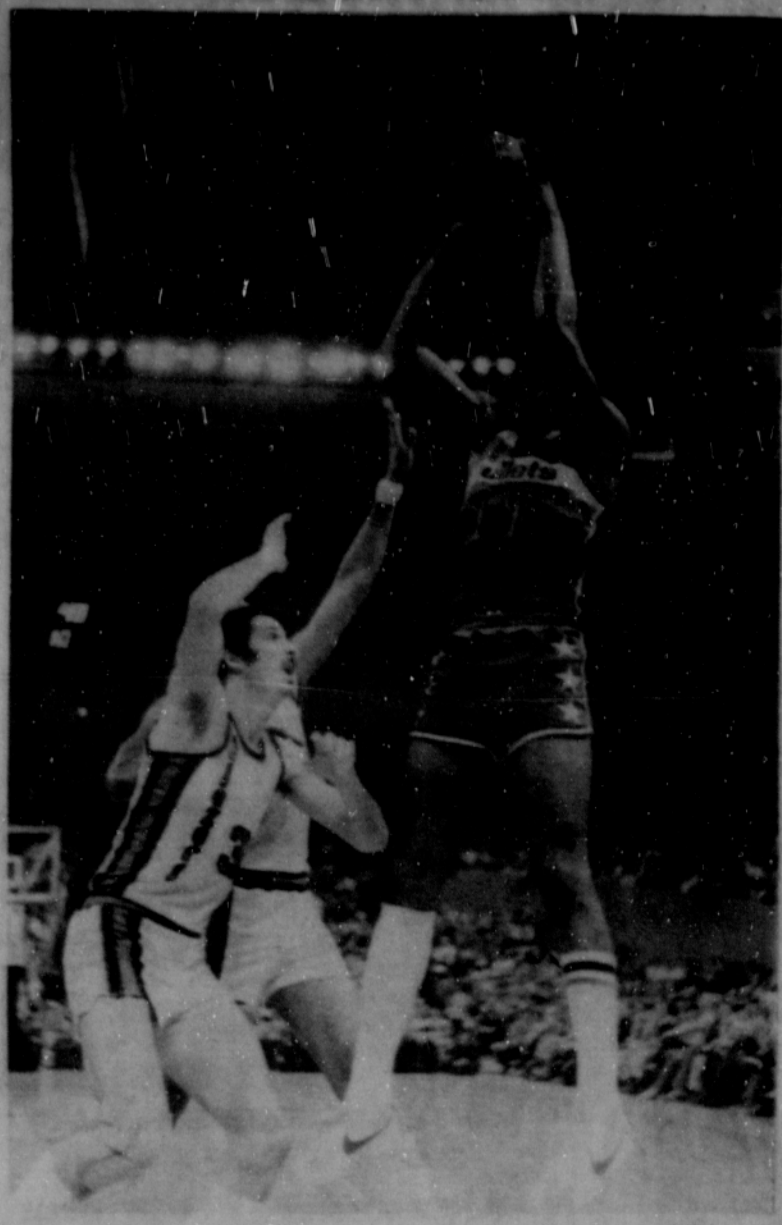

Concordia honors Black Awareness Month

Concordia College's fourth annual Black Awareness celebration is scheduled for the month of February. Various activities are planned throughout the month with an emphasis on Black history and culture. The Black Awareness Committee of Concordia, consisting of faculty, students and college administrators, have devoted hours in planning the month in order to provide educational and entertaining activities. Emphasis for the month is in raising the awareness of the college community to the Black culture.

Rozell Gilmore, Director of Minority Affairs at Concordia stated, "This month represents an attempt to bring people closer together in understanding themselves and their different cultures." He

further added, "It is an opportunity for all of us to understand the significance of Roots."

"Kick-off" day for the month-long celebration is Thursday, February 10th. A film festival is scheduled beginning at 9:00 a.m. in Concordia's Fine Arts Building. The films selected will focus on aspects of the Black experience.

On Thursday, February 24, Dr. Jacob Carruthers, Chairman of the Center for Inner-City Studies at Northeastern Illinois University in Chicago, Illinois, will be the keynote speaker. Dr. Carruthers' lecture, beginning at 11:10 a.m., will address the issue of present-day racism and the diverse ways it is demonstrated. He attended a Black college, lived in the South, and is well versed on the Black experience.

Mental health programs discussed

A neighborhood workshop meeting to discuss establishing a community mental health center for North and Northeast Portland will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, February 17th, at the Neighbors North Office, 7508 N. Herford Avenue.

The workshop is aimed at residents of Portland's St. Johns, Portsmouth, University Park, Kenton, Arbor Lodge and Overlook neighborhoods.

This is the first of a series of North Area neighborhood workshops. Public planning meetings for North and Northeast Portland residents have been held on December 8th and January 20th, at which approximately 100 and 80 persons respectively attended.

The workshop is open to professionals and mental health agencies. Those working in human service related organizations, school officials, representatives of neighborhood organizations and other interested persons.

It is sponsored by the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Oregon Health Science Center School of Medicine, which received a one year planning grant from the HEW for the project. For further information please contact the UOHC Psychiatry Department.
