



Owner offers award

An arson fire occurred on October 1, 1977 at 2:54 a.m. at the Diesel Service Unit Company, 555 N. Lagoon. Seven trucks were set on fire causing a loss of \$141,000. Wallace Yost, president of the company, is offering a reward of \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the fire.

Anyone having information should call 232-8135 and ask for Fire Bureau Investigation or mail information to Chief Investigator Rex Millard, 55 S.W. Ash, Portland 97204. The person providing information will apply for the reward through the Fire Bureau Committee. The reward will be offered for one year from the date of the fire.

Justice enters Bakke case

The Carter Administration stated its view last week that it is constitutional to use race as one factor in affirmative action programs.

The anti-discrimination stand came in a 74-page brief filed with the U.S. Supreme Court by the Justice Department.

Consideration of race is important to help adjust for differences caused by discrimination, it said. The legal language says: "It is appropriate to take race into account to adjust for differences in credentials that may have been caused by discrimination but do not reflect differences in ability to succeed or in ability to contribute to the medical profession and the health of the general population."

The brief was filed in the Bakke case now before the Supreme Court, on a writ of certiorari from the California Supreme Court. Bakke, who is white, filed suit in 1974 charging the University of California Medical School at Davis twice denied him admission solely because of his race.

The Justice Department asked the Supreme Court to reverse the California Court judgment that Bakke should be admitted to the Medical School.

It recommended that other questions be sent back to the California Supreme Court on the grounds that the record is not clear and facts are needed to determine exactly how the special admissions program operated.

"The most important principal involved here is that because the effects of racial discrimination are not easily eliminated, mere neutrality toward race often is inadequate to rectify what has gone before... Consideration of race also is necessary in devising remedies for private discrimination."

Class explains attorney role

Roland Johnson delves into the elements of a trial for those interested in learning more about the legal system. The course will give an attorney's perspective of the pleadings, investigation, research, evaluation, negotiation, litigation and appeal of a typical civil lawsuit.

Tips on when to file a lawsuit and when to try an individual case will also be shared by Johnson.

An attorney for an insurance defense-litigation firm for the past three years, Johnson recently has become assistant counsel for Portland General Electric. He graduated from University of Oregon law school in 1974 and received his B.A. degree from Harvard in 1971.

HUD takes compliance role

Beginning October 1, 1977, the Department of Housing and Urban Development assumed a larger role in insuring that construction contractors comply with Federal equal employment opportunity requirements.

Under the contract compliance consolidation program announced last year by the Department of Labor, positions formerly allotted to the Departments of Commerce and Health, Education and Welfare, and the Veterans Administration, have been transferred to HUD.

The transfers involve six positions and \$144,000 from Commerce, 52 jobs and 1,534 jobs from Health, Education and

Welfare, and nine jobs and \$350,000 from the Veterans Administration.

Chester C. McGuire, Jr., HUD assistant Secretary for Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity, said the consolidation reduces from fifteen to five the number of Government agencies now charged with enforcement responsibilities under Executive Order 11246.

The order prohibits contractors and subcontractors on Federal and federally-assisted projects from engaging in employment discrimination on account of race, color, sex, religion, or national origin.

Marylhurst offers jazz courses

"There are many people in the Portland area who are interested in taking courses in the history and development of jazz as well as fundamentals, improvisation, composition and arranging," said Robert Dietsche, one of the Northwest's authorities on jazz concerning the new Jazz Studies Degree Program at Marylhurst Education Center.

Dietsche is teaching "Jazz History - Style Analysis" and "Development of Jazz." In the first, Dietsche uses musicians, films, tapes and scores to direct the class in an analysis and exploration of the more influential soloists, groups and composers. The student develops a knowledge of various periods, styles and forms of jazz through the juxtaposition of lecture or tape with a live performance by musicians in the classroom. Class time and place will be announced.

"Development of Jazz" surveys music in the jazz idiom from its origins to the present and examines the principle musicians and composers and their works. Class time and place will be announced.

Dennis Plies, who brings his experience with Jamey Aebersold, Pat George and Dick Grove to augment his extensive background as a jazz performer, is

teaching "Jazz Fundamentals" and "Jazz Improvisation." Students in the first will work on theory and techniques of jazz improvisation, with emphasis on functional harmony, melodic form, special scales, tune studies, ear training and development of style. This class meets at Marylhurst Tuesdays and Fridays, 10:00 to 11:00 a.m.

"Jazz Improvisation" will help the student synthesize his previously acquired skills through creative application to tunes. Parallel transcription and analysis will be covered. This class will meet at Marylhurst Tuesdays and Fridays, 11:00 to 12:00 noon.

Classes in Directed and Independent studies in Jazz Composition and Arranging, as well as in Modern Harmonic Relationships in Jazz, are offered for advanced students by Dennis Esselstrom.

New to the Marylhurst faculty is Norman Parr, a native Oregonian, who comes from Cincinnati where he has had wide experience in directing prize winning jazz ensembles, to develop a Lab Band, Swing Choir, and instrumental and choir ensembles.
