Error corrected

Mrs. Osly J. Gates has been informed by Commerce Clearing House that an error in their publication will be corrected. The company had, in Volume 13 Employment Practices and Decisions, referred to Gates vs. Georgia Pacific as a sex discrimination rather than a race discrimination case.

The case was nine years in litigation and includes landmark legal precedents.

Mrs. Gates had brought the error to the company's attention, requesting a correction.

Classes expand

Portland State University's Black Studies Certificate Program will offer a variety of new classes for winter term.

New day classes include one called "Minority Athletes," in which professional athletes will appear as guest lecturers. Also offered will be a class in "Management Dynamics" and one in "Black Police Relations."

Evening classes will include a "Black Community-Urban Structure" course which will be taught in four segments focusing on politics and criminal justice, urban structures, and health.

Highway Division seeks minority program proposals

The Oregon State Highway Division is seeking proposals for a project to develop a program to assist minority business enterprises become more proficient in the highway construction industry. H. Scott Coulter, state highway engineer, announced.

The agency proposes to engage professional assistance to perform independent, objective surveys to obtain current information and data considered necessary to provide an effective program.

The program will include a survey of existing minority business enterprises to determine the type and extent of assistance required to increase their participation in highway construction. There will also be a survey of on-going minority business enterprise assistance and service programs to determine the type of related assistance currently being provided to minority business enterprises by other governmental agencies.

It will also ask for recommendations for the development of effective assistance

and/or training programs.

The surveys shall consider, but not be limited to, the following areas of technical assistance: Prequalification procedures; bidding procedures; bonding; preparation of bids; record keeping; accounting procedures; office management; reading and understanding plans and specifications; furnishing quotes to prime contractor; soliciting quotes from subcontractors; standard specifications for highway construction; and federal and state laws and regulations.

The services requested are to be completed no later than 90 days following acceptance of the contract by the Transportation Commission, with award of the contract anticipated in early 1978. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has allocated \$12,000 for the program.

Persons interested in performing the services for this project should submit ten copies of their proposal to C.T. Keasey, construction engineer, Oregon

Department of Transportation, Transportation Building, Salem, Oregon 97310, on or before December 27, 1977.

The Oregon State Highway Division also is seeking proposals for the supplying of services to support on-the-job training programs for highway construction workers by highway contractors on federal-aid highway projects, particularly in the area of minorities, women and the disadvantaged.

Purpose of the supportive program is to increase the overall effectiveness of approved on-the-job training programs on federal-aid highway construction projects, particularly in providing meaningful training opportunities for minority groups. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has allocated \$75,000 to fund the program.

The services to be provided are those not generally considered a part of actual on-the-job craft training but which are considered necessary for the overall effectiveness of these training programs.

Among the types of services included are those relating to recruiting, counseling, placement, transportation, physical examinations, remedial training, administration of programs, development of capabilities, and continuation of training during seasonal shut-down periods.

The proposed services are to be provided for a one-year period beginning in early 1978.
