NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Sealed bids for the construction of Sewage System Facilities and two (2) Pump Stations for the Roads End Sanitary District, in Lincoln County, Oregon, will be received until 3:00 P.M., P.S.T. on April 7, 1978. Bids submitted prior to the opening will be received by H.G.E., Inc., 19 Northwest Fifth Avenue, Portland, Oregon, 97209. Bid opening will be conducted at the Roads End Sanitary District office, 1904 N.E. 74th, Lincoln City, Oregon.

The project has been divided into three schedules for bidding purposes. Schedule "A" contains work eligible for Federal funding and Schedule "I" contains work ineligible for Federal funding. Schedules "A" and "I" will be awarded to a single contractor. Schedule "B" may be awarded together with Schedules "A" and "I", or separately. The project pertains to Sanitary Force Mains, Trunk Sewers and Pump Stations, with the following approximate major quantities:

Non-bidders deposits will be refunded only if documents are returned, in good condition, no later than the date of bid opening. Bid bond is to be forfeited as a fixed and liquidated damage should the bidder neglect or refuse to enter into a contract and provide suitable bond for the faithful performance of the work in the event the contract is awarded to him. Funds for the improvement are available, and monthly payments will be made by check.

No bid will be considered by Roads End Sanitary District or any officer thereof, unless the bid contains a statement by the bidder as a part of his bid that the provisions required by ORS 279.350 shall be included in this Contract.

The Roads End Sanitary District reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive all informalities. No bidder may withdraw or modify his bid after the hour set for the opening and thereafter until after the lapse of sixty (60) days from the bid opening.

This project must comply with the grant's ten percent Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Requirements.

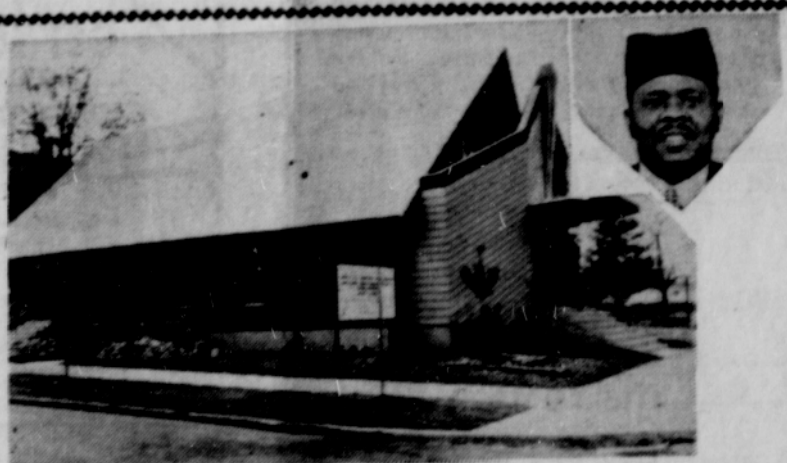
Federal provisions relating to Equal Employment Opportunity & the Davis Bacon Act apply.
