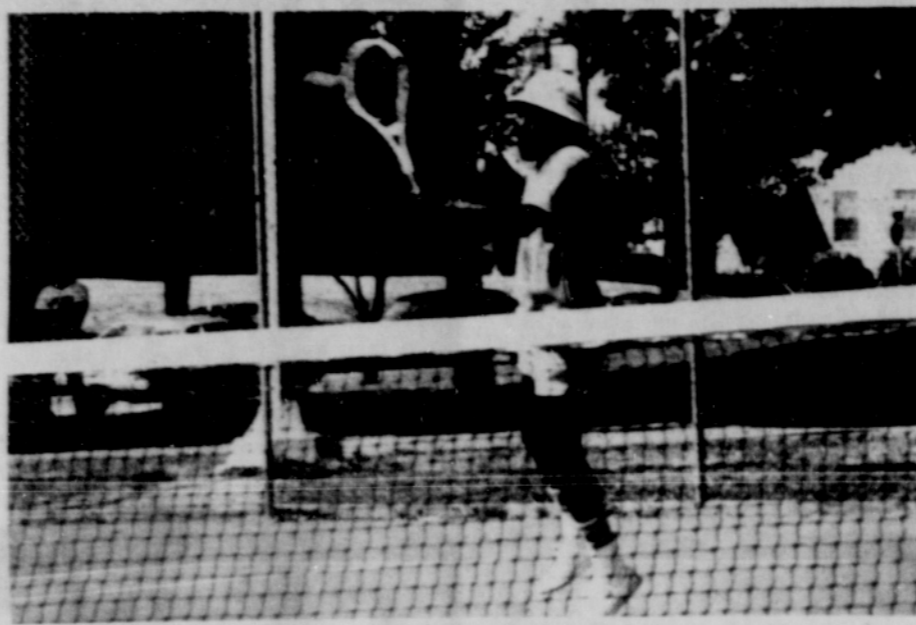
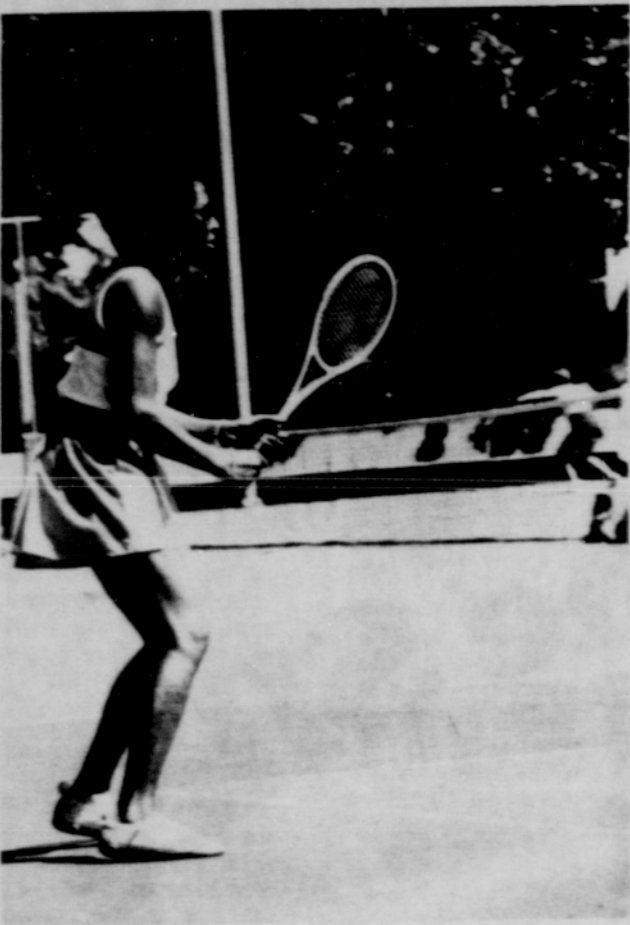


Ronald Milliken won the Men's Open Singles Championship and the Men's Doubles Championship. (above left)

NE UNION AVENUE STREET PROJECT

PUBLIC HEARING SEPTEMBER 13, 1978

The City of Portland invites the public to attend the Corridor-Design Public Hearing on the NE Union Avenue Arterial Reconstruction Project for transportation improvements to NE Union Avenue, State Route 99E, between NE Weidler Street and Columbia Boulevard, approximately 3.5 miles; the entire project lying within the City of Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon.

The formal Public Hearing on these transportation plans will be held in the Cafeteria of King School, 4815 NE 7th Ave., Portland, Oregon, on Wednesday, September 13, 1978, beginning promptly at 7:00 pm. Detailed maps and drawings of three design plans and other pertinent information will be on display and available for review and discussion. The tentative schedules for right-of-way acquisition and construction and the relocation assistance program will also be discussed. Any interested persons or groups desiring to express an opinion regarding the proposed plans are encouraged to do so at this time. In addition, persons or groups may submit written statements at the Public Hearing or to the City Engineer's Office within ten days after the hearing.

An informal informational hearing will be held earlier the same day, Wednesday, September 13, 1978, from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm, in the display area of the King Neighborhood Facility, 4815 NE 7th Ave., Portland, Oregon. The design plans and other pertinent information will be on display and the public is welcome anytime.

DESIGN PLANS FOR NE UNION AVENUE
 Three design plans are being considered to improve NE Union Avenue. Many of the basic design ideas are common to all three plans: utilize the existing right-of-way with very little acquisition; maintain four moving lanes; widen the roadway to 50' to meet the State standards; provide more left-turns and signals at major intersections; provide transit improvements including more bus shelters; improve street lighting; remove remaining on-street parking; investigate development of public parking lots; and straighten the S-curve at NE Hancock. In addition to these common design ideas, Plan #1 contains a continuous raised center median landscaped with trees and ground cover; Plan #2 contains sections of raised center median with landscaping and sections of two-way left-turn lanes; and Plan #3 contains a continuous two-way left-turn lane.

A project environmental report, Draft Negative Declaration, has been prepared and the Oregon Department of Transportation concludes that implementing this project will not significantly affect the quality of our environment.

Copies of the Draft Negative Declaration and maps and drawings developed for the Project will be available for public inspection and copying at the Main Branch and Albina Branch of the Multnomah County Library, the City Engineer's Office at 400 SW 6th Ave., Portland, the Portland Development Commission Office at 4008 NE Union Ave., Portland, and the Oregon Department of Transportation at 5021 NE Glisan St., Portland.
