Williams elected to Demo meet

Two members of the Oregon Assembly for Black Affairs were elected to represent Oregon Demos at this year's Mid-term convention. Of the seventeen delegates from Oregon, only eleven were elected. The other delegates will be the Governor, Chair and Vice-Chair of the State Democratic Party, and the three Democratic National Committee members.

Pina B. Williams was elected as the Third Congressional District female representative. Ms. Williams

presently serves on the Executive Board of the Multnomah County Central Committee, Precinct Committee person, and District Leader for district #13. With encouragement from only a few, Ms. Williams feels that her "long hours of meetings and stick-to-it attitude paid off."

Calvin O. Henry of Corvallis was chosen as alternate for delegate-at-large. Senator Bill McCoy will attend the convention as a member of the Democratic National Committee.
