

## Invitation to Bid

### ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed bids for KOAP-FM and KOAP-TV Building Remodeling, Oregon Educational and Public Broadcasting Service, will be received by the Oregon State Board of Higher Education at 2828 S.W. Front Avenue, Portland, Oregon, until 3:00 P.M. Pacific Standard Time, November 2, 1978, and then publicly opened and read aloud in the Conference Room by the Undersigned or his designated representative.

Briefly, the work is described as renovation of the existing facilities to reduce the architectural barriers for the access and use by the physically handicapped. Also, to correct violations of State, City, and Local Building Codes as well as the building's general conditions in energy conservation, emergency lighting, fire alarm system, and mechanical and electrical systems.

Separate bids will be received on a lump-sum basis for five separate categories of the work. An optional combination bid for all five categories of work is also provided. One set of drawings, specifications and form of contract documents may be obtained by prime bidders only, from Dielschneider Associates Inc., 71 S.W. Oak Street, Portland, Oregon 97204, upon deposit of fifty dollars (\$50.). Additional sets may be obtained for the cost of reproduction.

Deposits made upon procurement of drawings, specifications and forms of contract documents will be refunded upon return thereof in good conditions by actual bidders within two weeks after opening of bids, but to nonbidders only if returned no later than one week prior to bid opening.

Bidders for the General work (Basic Bid "A") are required to be prequalified in accordance with the Oregon State Board of Higher Education Administrative Rule. Applications for prequalification (or notice of intent to bid if the contractor has a current prequalification application on file with the Undersigned) must be received at least ten (10) days before the bid opening.

Prequalification of bidders is not required for those contractors proposing to bid on the Roofing work (Basic Bid "B"), the Elevator work (Basic Bid "C"), the Mechanical work (Basic Bid "D"), or the Electrical work (Basic Bid "E"). However, those bidders wishing to determine their prequalification status pursuant to ORS 279.041 (1) must submit a request therefor at least ten (10) days prior to the bid opening date.

All bids must contain a statement assuring compliance with ORS 279.350 relating to prevailing rates of wage.

No bid will be considered unless fully completed in the manner provided in the "Instructions to Bidders" upon the Bid Form provided by the Architects and accompanied by the bid security executed in favor of the State of Oregon and the Oregon State Board of Higher Education in an amount equal to ten (10) percent of the total amount of the bid, to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages should the bidder neglect or refuse to enter into a contract and provide suitable Bond for the faithful performance of the work in the event the contract is awarded to him.

The Oregon State Board of Higher Education reserves the right to reject all bids and to waive all informalities.

No bidder may withdraw his bid after the hour set for the opening thereof until after the elapse of 30 days from the bid opening.

## J C Penney recalls bicycles

WASHINGTON — The J.C. Penney Company Inc., in cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), rewarded bike riders that about 33,500 bicycles marketed under the "J.C. Penney" brand name have a defective pedal crank that could break, possibly resulting in serious injury to the rider.

The bicycles with the possibly faulty cranks are derailure-type, 24-, 26-, and 27-inch, 10-speed, lightweight vehicles in light tan and dark grey color, manufactured in 1977 and 1978 by the Huffy Corporation, Dayton, Ohio.

J.C. Penney marketed the bicycles in their retail and catalog stores in all fifty states and Puerto Rico. One bike sold under the Penney's name was associated with a laceration injury that occurred when the pedal crank broke.

Consumers can tell if they have one of the bicycles by looking for the numbers 2131A1, 2141A2, 2180A1 or 2181A1 on the outside of the left, rear, metal axle plate where the wheel is attached. Also appearing with each number is a J.C. Penney catalog number. The light tan bike imprinted with catalog numbers 927-3525, 927-3533, 927-7070, 927-7088, 927-7096, 927-7104 or 927-7112. Dark grey bicycles bear catalog number 927-7120.

Penney's and CPSC strongly urge consumers who own one of the possibly defective bikes to contact a J.C. Penney store or catalog center for free inspection and, if necessary, replacement of the pedal crank.

A recall that included the J.C. Penney bicycles was first announced by the Huffy Corporation and CPSC on May 31, 1978.
