## Christmas Vespers scheduled

The University of Portland Chambers Singers will present its annual Christmas Vespers Concert the evening of December 2nd in the new addition to the Wilson W. Clark Memorial Library. Dr. Roger O. Doyle, Associate Professor of Music, will conduct performances at 6:30 and 8:30 p.m.

Dr. Margaret Vance, Associate Professor of Music, will conduct this year's sing-in. The Christmas sections of the Messiah will be sung, featuring student soloists and accompanied by full orchestra.

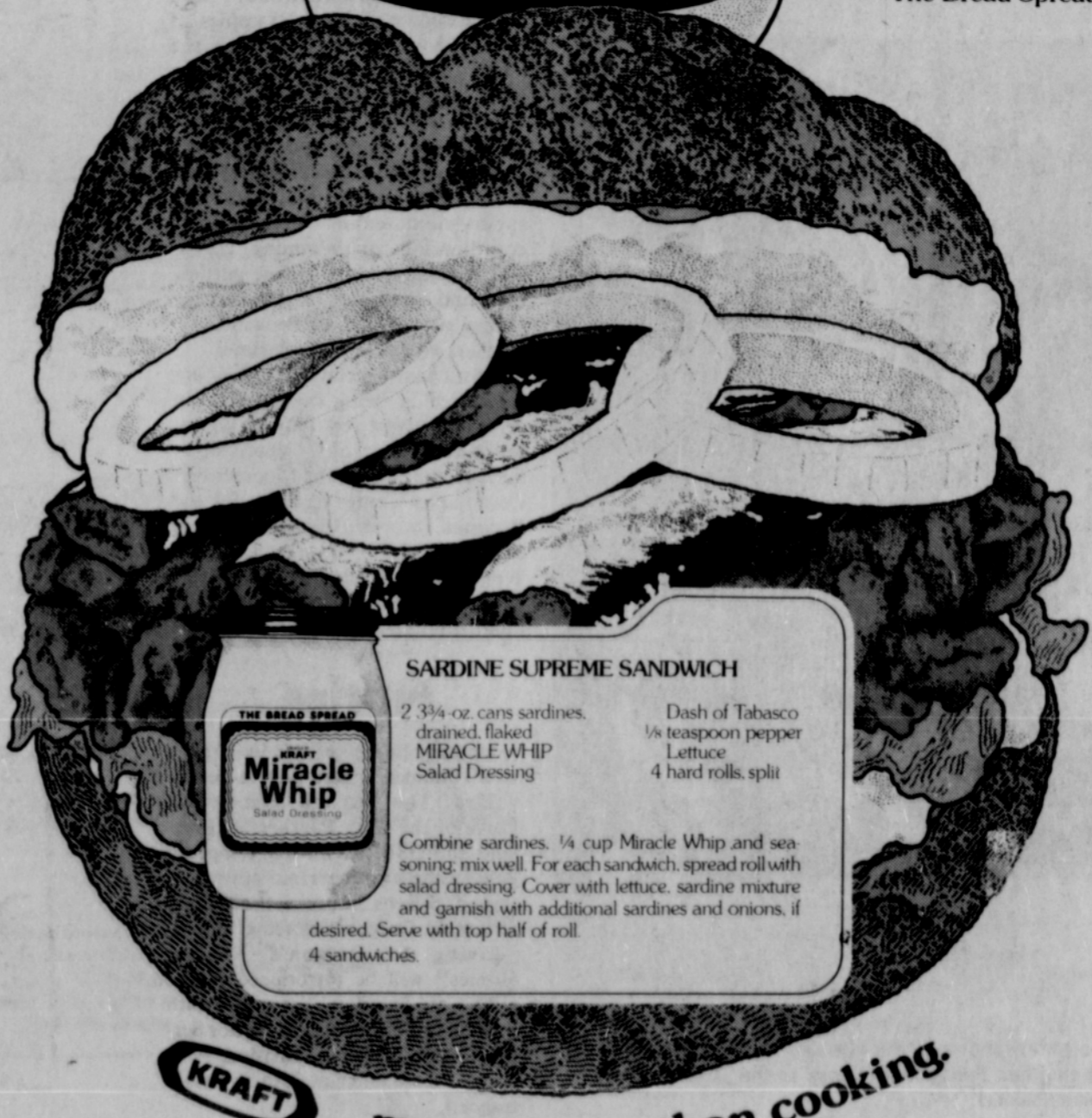
