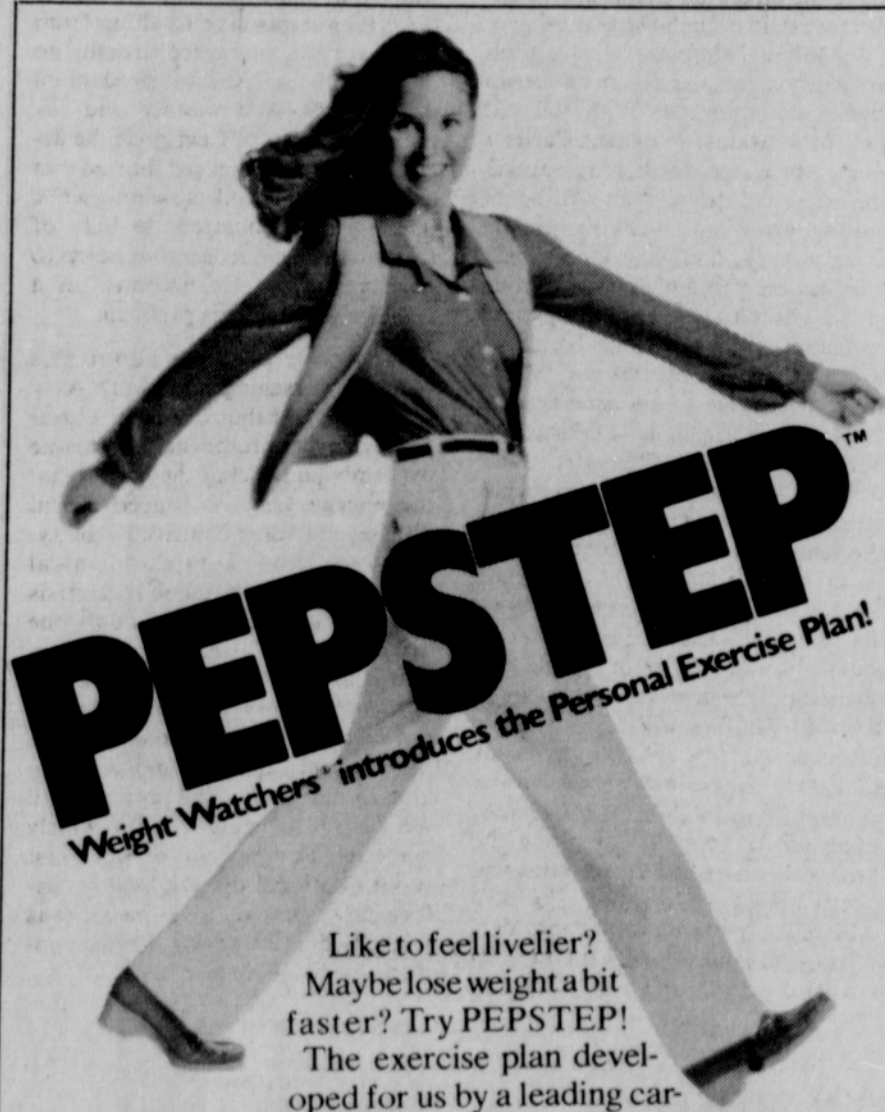
downtown and for shops in Lloyd Center.

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Blue Book available

Copies of the 1979-1980 official Oregon Blue Book are now being distributed free of charge to state and local officials, governmental agencies and public schools throughout Oregon, according to Secretary of State Norma Paulus.

As provided by statute, the general public must pay for the 384-page book filled with facts, figures and pictures about Oregon's past and present. Due to increased printing costs, the price this year will be \$3. The book may be purchased by mail or in person from the Secretary of State, Room 141, State Capitol, Salem 97310.

For the first time in its 68-year-old history the Blue Book pays tribute to a woman, Mrs. Paulus noted. It is dedicated to Abigail Scott Duniway, whose early endeavors on behalf of equal suffrage paved the way for the future election of a female Secretary of State. A Warm Springs Indian woman is also featured on the cover of the Oregon History chapter.

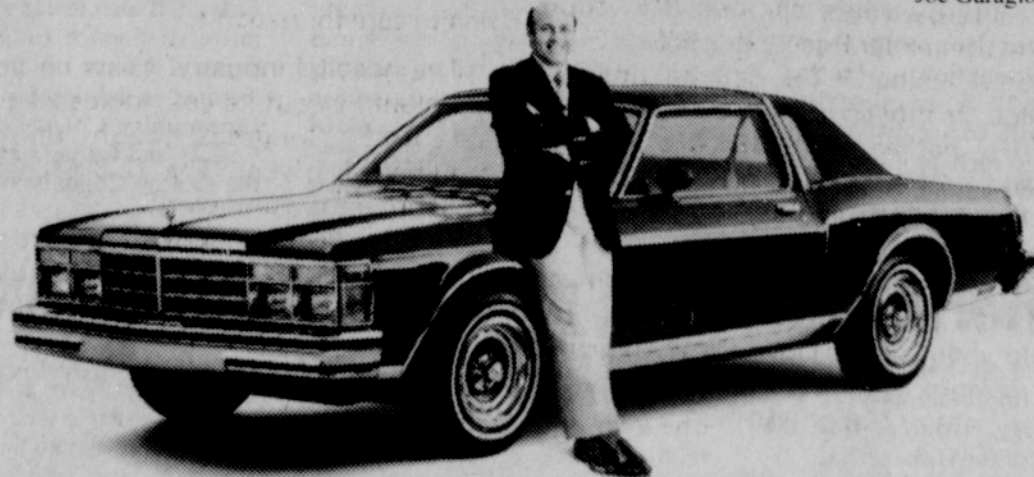
The 1979-1980 book is divided into twelve chapters, one each on general information; the executive, judicial and legislative branches of government; finances and institutions; education and culture; economy and resources; communication; counties and cities; national and international; elections and constitution; and Oregon history.

Several major additions were made this year on the basis of recommendations received by the Secretary of State's office. A selected list of cultural events or points of interest in communities throughout the state was provided by the Oregon Historical Society. The Oregon history was rewritten by Gordon Dodds of Portland State University. More material on Oregon's economy and resources as well as additional statistical charts, graphs and reference tables were also included.

The roster of Oregon agencies, boards and commissions was updated through February 1st to reflect the change in administration and subsequent change in officials, Mrs. Paulus said, but the printing schedule necessitated a cut-off at that point.
