Sears suit

(Continued from page 2 col. 3) grievances of discrimination. "Many of the rules and regulation about which Sears complains were created after the enactment of the 1964 Civil Rights Act. Prior to that, there is no question that Sears, like many other private and government employers, were discriminating against Blacks. But largely through the efforts of its late Chairman Julius Rosenwald, Sears in recent years has been regarded as a friend of minorities.

"The fact, therefore, that progress was made in opening up opportunities to minorities in the last 12 years could only be regarded as evidence that, where there are laws, rules, regulations and correct government policy, employers will take steps to end discrimination.

"For these reasons, the NAACP has called upon Sears to withdraw its suit. If this is not done, the Association is prepared to challenge the suit either through a direct counter-challenge or as a friend of the court."

Junius Williams, president of the National Bar Association, said the Sears suit challenges the federal government's affirmative action policies. "There is no lack of clarity with respect to the legal and moral obligations for an integrated work force. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 clearly outlines the obligations of employers. Any actions designed to side step these regulations are an attempt to dodge responsibility and create an aura of confusion.

"Large corporations like Sears are uniquely positioned to initiate and maintain this kind of litigation. If corporations are allowed to pursue these tactics they will tie up and drain the limited resources of civil rights organizations and their attorneys in waging meaningless and pointless litigation."

Jesse Jackson, executive director of PUSH, and the National Newspaper Publishers Association have called for a four month boycott of Sears to demonstrate opposition to the suit in a manner that will bring economic pressure to bear.

The announced 5 per cent discount on catalogue items is not a response to this boycott, but a response to the finding by the Carter Administration that Sears prices exceeded the voluntary wage-price guidelines and a personal request by President Carter for a cutback on prices.

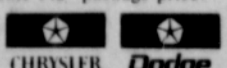
