Pursuant to the Administrative Rules of Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board (AR 40-030) prequalification of contractors shall be required for all projects estimated to cost more than \$50,000. Non-Discrimination in Employment. Bidders on this work will be required to comply with the provisions of Federal Executive Order 11246. The requirements for Bidders and Contractors are explained in the Specifications.

Specifications are filed with the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners and copies may be obtained at Purchasing Office, 2505 SE 11th, Portland.

No bid will be received or considered unless the bid contains a statement by the bidder as part of his bid that the requirements of Section (4) 279.350, 279.352, 279.354, 279.355 & 279.356 shall be met.

No proposal will be considered unless accompanied by a check payable to Multnomah County, certified by a responsible bank, or in lieu thereof, a surety bond for an amount equal to ten per cent of the aggregate proposal. The successful bidder shall furnish a bond satisfactory to the Board in the full amount of the contract.

Multnomah County reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

INVITATION TO BID

Sealed Proposals for the construction of Bend Sewage Collection System, Contract No. 14, Subsystems E6, H, A2, and B addressed to the Recorder-Treasurer, City of Bend, Oregon, will be received at the office of the Recorder-Treasurer, City Hall, Bend, Oregon, until 10:30 a.m., local time, on the 10th day of July, 1979, and then will be publically opened and read in the City Commission Room, 710 Wall Street, Bend, Oregon.

The work contemplated consists of construction of Schedule A (Subsystems E6 and H) and Schedule B (Subsystems A2 and B), as follows:

SCHEDULE A — PART 1 — SEWERS

Approximately 18,350 linear feet of 6-inch through 15-inch gravity sewer, 700 linear feet of 21-inch, 2,200 linear feet of 2-inch through 4-inch pressure pipe, 1,850 linear feet of 16-inch pressure pipe; complete with manholes, surface restoration, two railroad crossings, two bridge crossings and related appurtenances.

SCHEDULE A — PART 2 — SERVICE CONNECTIONS

Approximately 3,000 linear feet of 4-inch and 6-inch service connection pipe, with surface restoration and other appurtenances.

SCHEDULE B — PART 1 — SEWERS

Approximately 8,900 linear feet of 6-inch through 18-inch gravity sewer; 13,300 linear feet of 24-inch through 30-inch gravity sewer; 20,000 linear feet of 36-inch and 42-inch gravity sewer pipe; complete with manholes, surface restoration, canal crossings, a 5,000 linear foot double barrel siphon and related appurtenances.

SCHEDULE B — PART 2 — SERVICE CONNECTIONS

Approximately 1,800 linear feet of 4-inch and 6-inch service connection pipe, with surface restoration and other appurtenances.

Plans and Specifications may be examined in the office of the Engineer, Bend Engineering Consultants, 61360-5 South Highway 97, Bend, Oregon. A copy of the Documents may be obtained at the Engineer's office upon payment of \$30 for each Document. No refunds will be made.

Each Proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond executed on the prescribed form, payable to the City of Bend, Oregon, in an amount not less than 10 percent of the amount bid.

The successful Bidder will be required to furnish the necessary additional bond(s) for the faithful performance of the Contract, as prescribed in the Contract Documents.

Bidders on this project will be required to comply with the provisions of the President's Executive Order No. 11246 and requirements issued thereunder. The requirements for Bidders and Contractors under this Order are specified in the Contract Documents.

The Bidder's attention is directed to the provisions of these Documents that relate to the utilization of minority business enterprises during the performance period of the Contract. The Environmental Protection Agency Region X has adopted the following goals for this Contract:

Ten to fifteen percent of construction work (on a dollar basis) shall be performed by minority subcontractors.

Ten to fifteen percent of construction supplies and materials shall be procured from minority-owned suppliers.

Prior to award of a contract, EPA will review the proposals with respect to the Bidder's degree of compliance with the above goals; a low bidder who has not achieved these goals must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Director, Office of Civil Rights and Urban Affairs, EPA Region X, that the goals are not attainable on the Contract work.

The attention of Bidders is directed to the federal and state government requirements and conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under the Contract.

Any Contract awarded under this INVITATION TO BID is expected to be funded in part by a grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Neither the United States nor any of its departments, agencies, or employees is or will be party to this INVITATION TO BID or any resulting Contract.

Before a Contract will be awarded, compliance with all EPA requirements specified in the Contract Documents will be subject to EPA review and approval.

A pre-bid conference for representatives, Bidders, and potential Bidders will be held prior to the date of bid opening. Information on the date, time, and place for the pre-bid conference will be sent by certified mail to all known holders of Bidding Documents.

The Owner reserves the right to reject all Proposals or any Proposal not conforming to the intent and purpose of the Contract Documents, and to postpone the award of the Contract for a period of time which, however, shall not extend beyond 45 days from the bid opening date.
