## Title VII reorganizes

"Title VII is on the move," Al Jamison, Chairman of the Portland Public Schools' Title VII committee told committee members at their first meeting of the year. The Title VII committee advises and monitors the desegregation program in 23 elementary and 13 high schools.

The Title VII project provides compensatory education for Black students who are transferred for desegregation and for white students in the receiving schools. A parent involvement component provides 30 paid Parent Activity Managers, to provide a liaison between the sending and receiving school and to encourage participation of Black parents at the receiving school.

A third component this year will be multi-cultural curriculum/teacher training.

Two high school students will be added. Jamison announced that this is the first time in three years that the Title VII money is assured at the time

school starts. During the past two years, the money was in jeopardy because of non-compliance findings by the federal government.

The recommendation of the Community Coalition for School Integration that there be a central administrator responsible for desegregation and the reorganization from three to two areas has brought in realignment in Title VII staff.

Four persons are assigned to the Central Administrator to work with Clint Thomas, Director of Desegregation Programs; Bobbie Nunn will work with the high schools to assist in implementation of desegregation, will work on compliance with federal and state regulations, and will serve as a liaison with community groups.

Pina Williams will be Advisory Specialist for elementary schools in Area II and Elaine Jamison will serve in that capacity in Area I. They will advise the principals in the area of desegregation.

Debbie Wolfe will coordinate teacher training and curriculum.

Joe Nunn will be Advisory Specialist for Area I and Linda Nickerson Advisory Specialist for Area II, with LeRoy Patton assigned to Adams. Each high school will have a coordinator to assist transfer students. They are: Larry Grant, Benson; Leon McKenzie, Jackson; Tony Hopson, Lincoln; Gloria Johnson, Roosevelt; Velma Johnson, Washington-Monroe; Joe Mays, Wilson; Ken Berry, Cleveland; Harriet Adair, Franklin; Donald Dixon, Madison; A.W. Williams, Marshall. Assignments have not been made to Jefferson, Adams and Grant. These are the persons students should contact with school problems.
