In a colorful day-long celebration, the 19th anniversary of Nigerian Independence was observed by the Portland Chapter of the National Union of Nigerian Students on Saturday, September 29.

# **Workshop explains Medicare**

The complexities of Medicare hospital and medical insurance will be explained to the public Thursday, October 25th, in a free seminar sponsored by Providence Medical Center as a public service.

The seminar is designed to assist Medicare recipients understand the processes of filing for benefits and claims. Information will be made available by representatives from Providence Medical Center's business office and social services department, Blue Cross of Oregon, and the Medicare Claims Administration of Aetna Life & Casualty Insurance Company. Trained volunteers from Providence Volunteer Services will help seminar participants complete whatever Medicare forms they bring with them and representatives from the hospital and other sponsoring agencies will show Medicare recipients how to most effectively use the services offered to them and what forms and other information used to be submitted to insure payment of the hospital and doctor bills.

Medicare is a two-part federal program to assist citizens 65 years and older or who are disabled pay for the medical expenses. Medicare hospital insurance pays for inpatient hospital care while Medicare medical insurance pays for physicians' services and outpatient hospital services. Medicare payments are handled by private insurance organizations like Aetna and Blue Cross who have contracts with the Health Care Financing Administration.


