First, at noon, there is a chance to see and hear Donald F. McHenry, the United States Ambassador to the United Nations. Remember, he was named to take Andrew Young's position when it was vacated by Mr. Young.

A one-day conference brings Mr. McHenry to Portland as a part of the activities of the World Affairs Council of Oregon as they discuss "Southern Africa Faces the 80s".

Herb Cawthorne

Herb Cawthorne was nothing less than sensational in his portrayal of W.E.B. DuBois recently at Portland State University in a Lincoln Hall performance presented three times during the week end.

We saw him the first night and learned a lot about DuBois and his times. Cawthorne was unforgettable. He had early command of his audience. They hung on his every word during his long soliloquy. The pathos, the pride of this great man's life came alive. Cawthorne's vocal timbre, voice control, diction and pace were all richly rewarding to hear.

The script, flawlessly written by Cawthorne and Jeanna Woolley, were strengthened by their recent research on DuBois, revealed DuBois as strikingly contemporary in thought, not blinking the fact that he died more than a decade ago at an age well past 90 years.

Staging and lighting were effective

Mr. and Ms. O. J. Gates are a busy couple, each working independently in the behalf of people and both accomplishing in fields not routinely tackled by Black people. For instance, Ms. Gates (she

usually signs her work: J.M. Gates) was the only Black person we saw exhibiting among all the others of the representatives of the private small free press of Oregon a few weeks ago in Portland's Art Quake.

J.M. Gates was representing her own "Circle Press". She publishes "Circle Forum", a medium in periodical form which she edits for poetry, a special kind of poetry called "reversible", as it can be read backwards as well as forward. J.M. Gates, as publisher, receives poetry from all over the world as her "Circle Forum" has an international readership.

Mr. Gates, meanwhile, aside from his job as director of the City-County Commission on Aging, has, since 1974, been a member of the Board of Directors of the National Council on Aging. He has been recently made chairman of its committee on the Minority Elderly.

The committee has provided the leadership to influence national legislation affecting the lives of the elderly, and especially, the minority elderly.

Gates expects to be in Washington, D.C. shortly to help put together several bills in an array of legislation to be reviewed and drafted at this meeting.

Gates is the only Black member of this board who hails from Oregon. The other member is Guy Frazier, a former vice president of Tektronix. Helen Hayes, the revered Broadway theatre star and Jack Albertson, the TV personality, are new members, along with Mr. Gates, on this important national board.

Mallory Avenue installs pastor

Reverend Richard L. Lauer will be installed as Senior Pastor of Mallory Avenue Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) on October 14th.

Reverend Mark K. Reid, Regional Minister, will deliver the installation message and administer the Act of Installation.

For the past ten years Reverend Lauer has served as Associate Regional Minister, the Christian Church in Oregon, with special responsibilities in Youth Ministries and in the Division of Mission. This past year Lauer and his family lived in Adelaide, South Australia, where he praticipated in an exchange program with the Churches of Christ in South Australia.

Reverend Lauer previously served as an Associate Regional Minister in Indiana and as pastor of Northview Christian Church in Kokomo, Indiana.

Reverend Lauer graduated from Oregon State University and Christian Theological Seminary, Indianapolis, where he received the Master of Divinity degree. A native of Portland, he graduated from Grant High school

He is on the Board of Directors of the Division of Homeland Ministries, a General Unit of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the USA and Canada, and his concern that the church be a caring community with a social ministry will fit well with the commitment of Mallory Avenue Church to community service.

Mallory was founded in 1921 by the merger of Rodney Avenue and Woodlawn Christian Churches. The church building is used during the week by several tenants including the Northeast YWCA, which offers a wide variety of classes and activities, and the Oregon Center for Peace and Justice, sponsored by several Roman Catholic Orders.

A successful and visible community service initiated by Mallory several years ago and now sponsored by Ecumenical Parish of Northeast Portland (consisting of four neighborhood churches including Mallory) is a summer program called "People are Beautiful" for neighborhood children and youth that includes arts and crafts, value clarification, camping and other activities.

Reverend Lauer and his wife, Doris, have two children: Daniel, a married son attending the University of Oregon, and Karen, a senior in high school.

The Installation Service will be held at the church, 126 N.E. Alberta, at 4:30 p.m. A reception will follow.
