

Y programs begin

"Are you bored, listless and itching for a change? Join the Northeast YWCA," invites Sherrian E. Haggard-Warren. "Your itch may not be scratched, but you may be so busy that you forget it," says the volunteer chairwoman of Northeast YWCA Community Relations Committee.

A variety of low-cost or free adult classes and special events and programs have begun at the Northeast YWCA.

For those who overindulged during the holiday season, a nine-session slimnastics course will be offered beginning Monday, January 28th from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Participants will be given lots of individual attention as they exercise to music and begin to feel better and look better. The fee will be \$11 for YWCA members. The YWCA membership fee is \$15 per year.

A Yoga course for relaxation will also be offered beginning Monday, January 28th from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Participants will be asked to wear loose, comfortable clothing and to bring a mat or large towel. The fee will be \$13.50 for YWCA members.

The Northeast YWCA will also offer members of the community a chance to express themselves through the arts. An Oil Painting class will begin on Tuesday, January 29th from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for six three-hour sessions. Class members will learn techniques of painting and will finish two or more paintings ready to frame and hang on their walls. The fee will be \$15 for YWCA members.

YWCA members may learn how to make beautiful low-cost rugs in Rug Braiding, a two-session workshop that will take place on Tuesday, February 5 and February 12th from 10:00 a.m. to noon. Participants will learn to make rugs from scraps, and some material will be available without cost. The fee will be \$2 for each session. The above classes are open to non-members at a slightly higher fee.

The Northeast YWCA has scheduled many special programs for the community. Those who wish to receive help with their sewing will find skilled volunteer instructors two days a week at the Northeast YWCA Sewing Center. Long cutting tables and excellent sewing machines are available for use. No fee is required for participation in the Sewing Center which is opened on Tuesdays from 12:00 to 3:00 p.m. and on Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

The Brunch Bunch meets on Wednesday mornings at the Northeast and attends cooking classes when in session. At other times, the group shares ideas on food preparation and nutrition, often taking field trips to food specialty stores and going out in the country to get fresh foods in season.

The Northeast YWCA Dekum doers is a group of friends who welcome new members. Dekum Doers schedules meetings in the evenings and on the weekends. Field trips, discussions and social gatherings often include the family.

For parents with high school age or slightly older children, the Northeast YWCA offers monthly gatherings for their group, Young Parents Together. "Get together" combine social activities with help in various areas including parenting skills, nutrition, housing, employment, education and more.

Tuesdays at Dekum Court, a YWCA program for residents of Dekum Court (N.E. 27th and Saratoga) and the neighborhood, meets at the Dekum Community Center and sometimes joins activities at the Northeast YWCA Center. The group participates in crafts, field trips and other activities.

The Northeast YWCA offers various programs for children and youth. A Girl's Swim for seventh and eighth grade girls from Boise School is offered on Wednesdays from 3:15 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. The girls are picked up at Boise School by the YWCA van at 3:15 p.m. and swim at the downtown YWCA from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. Girls are returned to their homes after the swim.

A Children's After-School Program is an arts and crafts program offered at the Northeast YWCA on Monday through Thursday from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. Arts and crafts, games, stories, movies, tutoring and woodworking are available.

For those who would like to spend some time on a regular basis with a child who would benefit from the experience of knowing another caring adult, the Northeast YWCA has organized the Share a Day program. To participate, adults must be eighteen years or over to work with the children six to thirteen years.
