NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned, the City Clerk-Treasurer of the City of Goldendale, Washington, up to the hour of 2:00 p.m. on the 14th day of FEBRUARY, 1980 for the construction of:

1980 WASTEWATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

Plans, Specifications and bid forms are available in the offices of the Engineer and may be obtained upon the submission of a refundable deposit of \$20.00 for each set.

The work contemplated under this contract includes the construction of approximately 9,000 linear feet of 18 inch, 21 inch and 24 inch interceptor sewer complete with all appurtenances thereto as shown on the plans and/or described in the specifications. This new interceptor sewer will extend from the existing treatment works on SR 122 west of the City to the site of the new treatment works on Horseshoe Bend Road southwest of the City.

Each bid or proposal must be accompanied by cash, bond or a certified check, payable to the order of the City of Goldendale, Washington for the sum of not less than 5% of said bid or proposal and none will be considered unless accompanied by such deposit, to be forfeited to the City of Goldendale in the event the successful bidder shall fail or refuse to enter into a contract with the City of Goldendale for the making and construction of the aforesaid improvements. All bids or proposals must be in writing, sealed and filed with the City Clerk-Treasurer on or before the day and hour above mentioned.

The work contemplated under this contract includes the construction of a new 0.8 MGD wastewater treatment works facility for the City of Goldendale at a new location approximately one mile southwest of the City limits. An interceptor connecting the existing works to the new works will be covered under a separately bid schedule of work.

Each bid or proposal must be accompanied by cash, bond or a certified check, payable to the order of the City of Goldendale, Washington for the sum of not less than 5% of said bid or proposal and none will be considered unless accompanied by such deposit, to be forfeited to the City of Goldendale in the event the successful bidder shall fail or refuse to enter into a contract with the city of Goldendale for the making and construction of the aforesaid improvements. 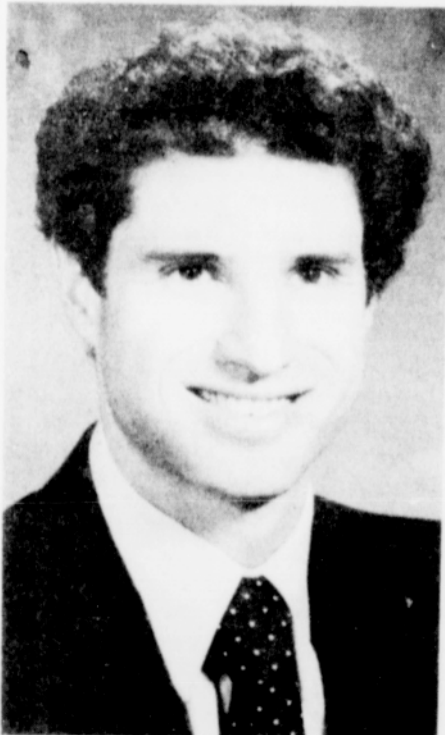

Ron Wyden addresses Black ministers

Claiming that his opponent "knows nothing about the Black community and does not even care enough to speak on the floor of the House for those issues most vital to the desire of the Black community for a better life," Third District Democratic contender Ron Wyden met this week with an influential group of Black ministers.

The Monday meeting at Bourbon Street Restaurant represents the first of a series of meetings planned by the Wyden campaign to hear the concerns of the Black community and devise means by which those concerns can be translated into action at the federal level.

"Robert Duncan is never heard on the issues that mean most to you," Wyden told the gathering. "No one has ever heard him mention the word 'housing' in his speeches. In a time when the elderly are being forced out of their homes, young families cannot buy homes, and when poor families must pay exorbitant rents, we have a con-

gressional representative who never mentions the word!"

Wyden was introduced to the group of ministers by Herb Cawthorne, a member of the Portland School Board.

"Ron Wyden has long been in the forefront of the battle to gain a better life for our elderly," Cawthorne told the ministers. "He challenged the nursing home system and developed coordination among our senior citizens to give them greater political clout. He has an excellent chance to beat Robert Duncan and he needs to know what we want him to do to gain our support."

Wyden delivered a strong message to the ministers, calling, for example, for the federal government to develop better coordination of welfare services in order to foster dignity and worth for those who need assistance. Rev. Oscar Peavy, First AME Zion Church, explained problems with the welfare system's expectation that local churches carry on services that the system is supposed to deliver. Rev. John H. Jackson, Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, suggested that Wyden should do whatever he could to "untangle" the confusing, unresponsive welfare organization.

Wyden, in answer to a question on unemployment, said such new developments as the expanding trade with China, which will bring a boost to the Northwest ports,

should be used to help insure jobs for Blacks and other minorities.

"I would work for ways to do this," Wyden said.

Wyden also said he would work at the federal level "to keep an eye on how federal funds are expended to reach those most needy at the local level. My record is a grassroots record and I will not lose touch with my district. One way I will maintain my contact with this community is by hiring someone who knows the Black community and is a part of it to be on my staff."

Black ministers in attendance (in addition to Rev. Peavy and Rev. Jackson) included Rev. Hampton Calloway, of Mt. Gillard Missionary Baptist Church, Chaplain James Coleman of Emanuel Hospital, Bishop J.C. Foster of St. Paul COGIC, Rev. W. G. Hardy, Mt. Sinai COGIC, Rev. L. Fisher Hines, Bethel AME, Rev. Jack Kelly of Redeemer Lutheran Church, Bishop Louis Osborne of Faith Tabernacle Church, and Rev. John Parker, Prison Ministries.

The Monday meeting was successful according to Wyden.

"I got a chance to hear concerns expressed clearly and with compassion," the Third District Congressional aspirant said. "I intend to use what I have learned to strengthen the issues to which I speak in this campaign."
