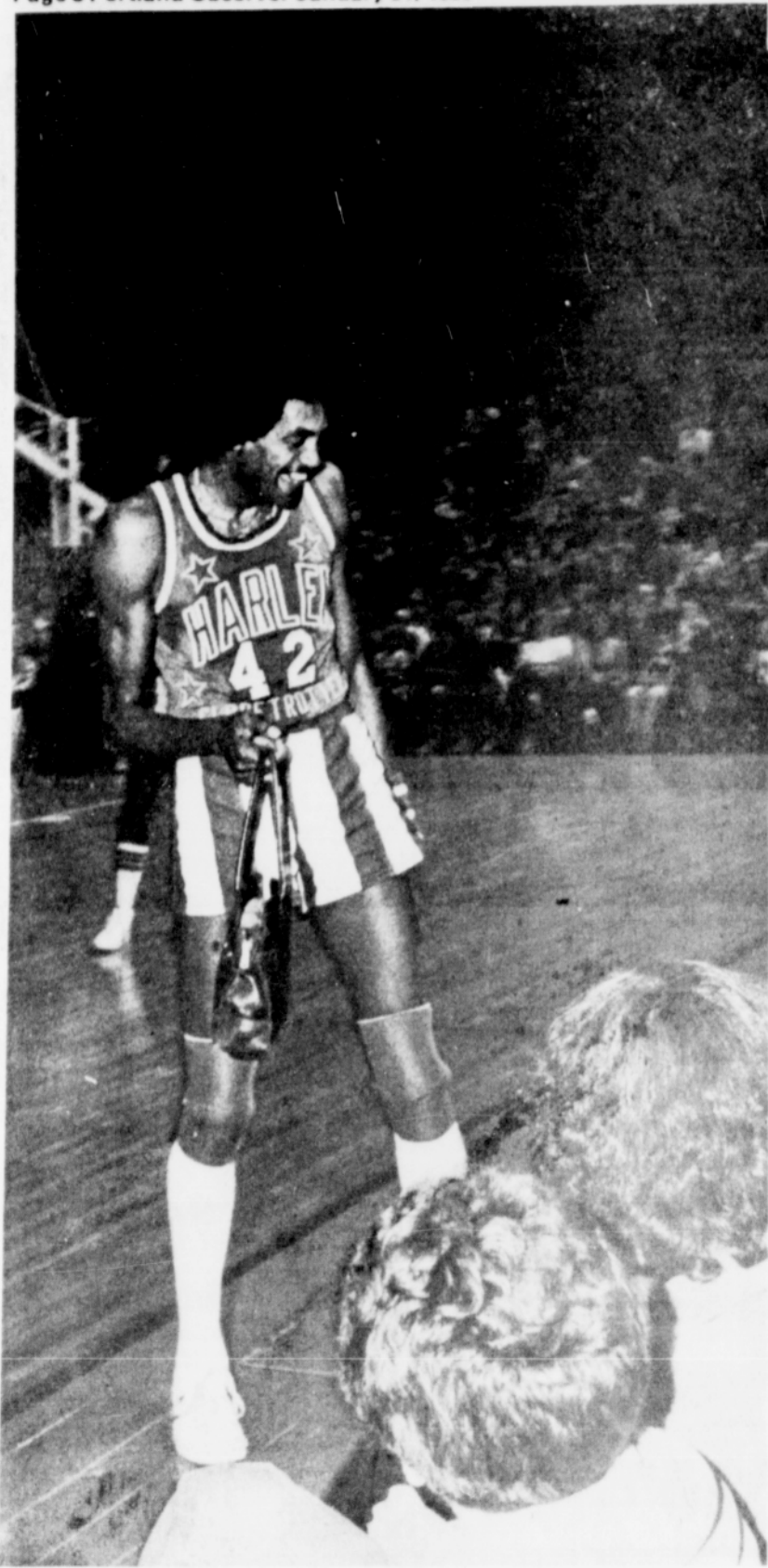

PCC teaches word processing

Sue George types 135 words per minute.

At Portland Community College where Mrs. George teaches, she trains secretaries who increase speeds 50 per cent—some jumping from 60 words per minute to 100.

The secret is the light touch of electronic keyboard on the new editing typewriters.

"Productivity increases 50 per cent because it is just faster," Mrs. George said.

Winter term Mrs. George is offering a one credit course in "Word Processing: Editing Typewriter" using the four new typing stations acquired by PCC at the Sylvania Center. These machines feed into printers which produce copies with perfect right and left margins at the rate of 420 words per minute.

Before the typist's work is fed into the electronic printer, however, the material is first checked over by an optical character scanner which reads the copy and checks for errors.

The equipment, including the typing terminals, printers and the optical character scanner, was purchased and installed this winter by PCC through a \$108,734 Federal Vocational Education basic grant.

Cascade Center, 705 N. Killingsworth, will have the editing typing stations available for PCC students enrolled in Typing II during Winter Term.

These new editing typewriters are the biggest thing around in business right now but quite a few people don't know how to use them or are afraid to try," Mrs. George said. She said once secretaries train on the machine they are pleased with the speed and the quality of the copies produced.

At PCC secretaries can enroll for a self-paced learning program on the editing typewriter according to Mrs. George. During Winter Term the editing typewriters will be available for self-paced learning from 10:00 a.m. - noon and 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. on weekdays and some weekday evening.
