PCC celebrates Black History Month

Community leaders including Portland Mayor Connie McCreedy and Urban League officer Mrs. Freddie Pettet, attended opening ceremonies at Portland Community College Cascade Center, 705 N. Killingsworth, February 1st, to kick off a month of Black Cultural Society events honoring Black Culture Month.

Bobby R. Campbell, president of PCC Black Cultural Society and vice president of student government, and the Black Cultural Society have set an agenda of daily activities free to any interested persons. Events include movies on Black history, history of music,

bake sales, concerts by gospel choirs, and a series of lectures on uniting Blacks in the 1980's by guest speakers from the Portland business community.

Robert Phillips, president of the National Association of Black Social Workers, was the first guest speaker.

James M. Tims, from the Northeast Career Training Center discussed the future of Blacks in the 1980's job market.

John Miller, a community activist from Northeast Portland spoke on community participation in government.

Bruce Broussard, a businessman, discussed economic development in

the 1980's and Thelma Tea, from the Oregon State Department of Education spoke on issues in education, during her lecture Wednesday.

A doctor of naturopathic medicine, Hugh A. Jenkins, will talk about health and naturopathy with a slide show at noon Friday February 15 at Cascade Center.

Each day except for those when speakers are scheduled, movies on the history of Blacks in America will be shown at noon in the Cascade Center Auditorium. The films include "History of the Negro in America," "New Mood," and "A Time for Burning."

On February 19th, James M. Tims will speak on "Blacks and Careers in the 1980's" at 1:00 p.m. in the auditorium. February 20th is Senior Citizens Day with students hosting elderly citizens for a discussion of early Blacks in Oregon.

The film "Heritage in Black" will be shown Thursday noon, February 21st, followed by a lecture on the History of Music by Bobby Campbell. At 7:00 p.m. Anthony Gilmour will be host to Langston Hughes skits and "J.B. and The One Nighter."

On February 22nd at noon, tumbling will be demonstrated by King Elementary School students, in the auditorium. Following, Jim Loving will speak on neighborhood involvement in Black culture. On Friday, King students will demonstrate tumbling at 12.30 in the auditorium.

At 7:00 p.m. a Fashion Show will be given in the cafeteria, followed at 9:00 a.m. by a dance. Music will be provided by "The Chosen Two and The Creative Force, with Nathaniel Harley and Sonya L. Coleman.

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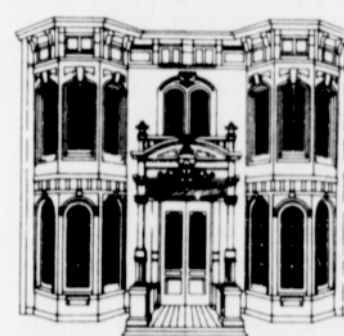
