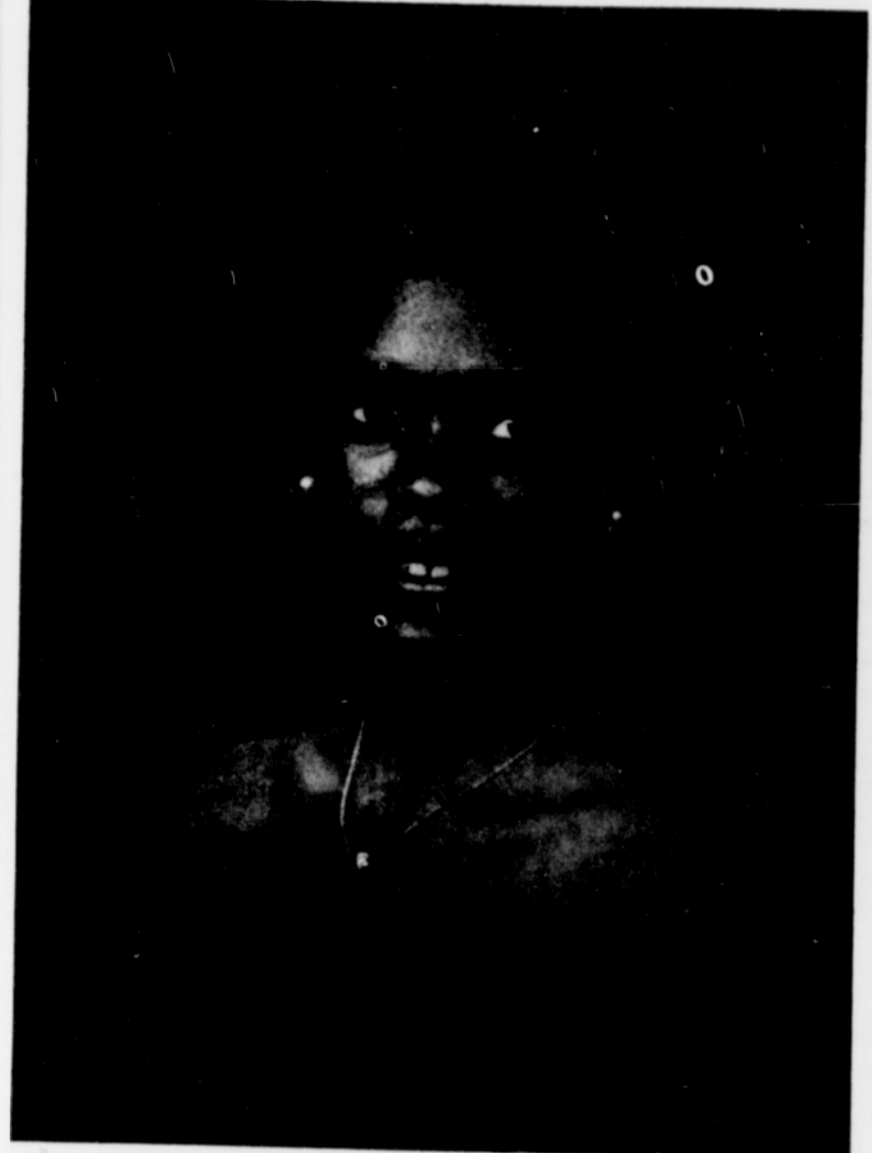

"FRED" is a creation of Ben Heil, Kim Toll and Mill McFadden, all Benson seniors majoring in electronics, who isn't very fancy but does what the three students wanted -- move on its own according to pre-programmed instructions.

About two feet high on a round,

wheeled base and exposing its innards to the world, FRED's heart is two computer boards made from purchased kits and an electronic control unit designed and constructed by the Benson students...and powered by a car battery.
