Judge Deiz attends National Judicial College

RENO, NV., -- Judge Mercedes F. Deiz of the Circuit Court received a Certificate of Completion at the graduation of the State Antitrust

Litigation-Specialty session, conducted at the National Judicial College March 2-7 on the University of Nevada-Reno campus.

This is the first program of its kind developed for state general jurisdiction trial judges. The program identifies the types of conduct prohibited or controlled by the various forms of antitrust legislation, recognizing two basic principles: competitor collaboration and distribution practices. Antitrust exemptions, defenses, jurisdiction and standing are also examined. The nature of antitrust actions usually brought in state courts is discussed, along with special issues concerning class actions and multi-party suits. Because of the often complex and detailed court procedures in antitrust actions, special attention is given to case management

techniques in these instances. Finally, issues concerning settlement procedures and consent decrees are reviewed.

Interaction with colleagues from other parts of the country is stressed in the education and training programs of the college. Forty-eight participants from 40 states and the District of Columbia attended this session, at which workshops, small group discussions, and demonstrations are used to emphasize the lecture material.

The all-volunteer faculty of the Judicial College is composed of respected judges, lawyers, professors and experts in related fields. Their contributions of time and talent is of great value to the College's goal of improving the administration of justice in this nation.

The National Judicial College is a non-profit Nevada corporation affiliated with the American Bar Association. Judge Ernst John Watts is Dean of the college, which

is the leading judicial education center in the United States, and which has just completed its 16th year of career judicial training.
