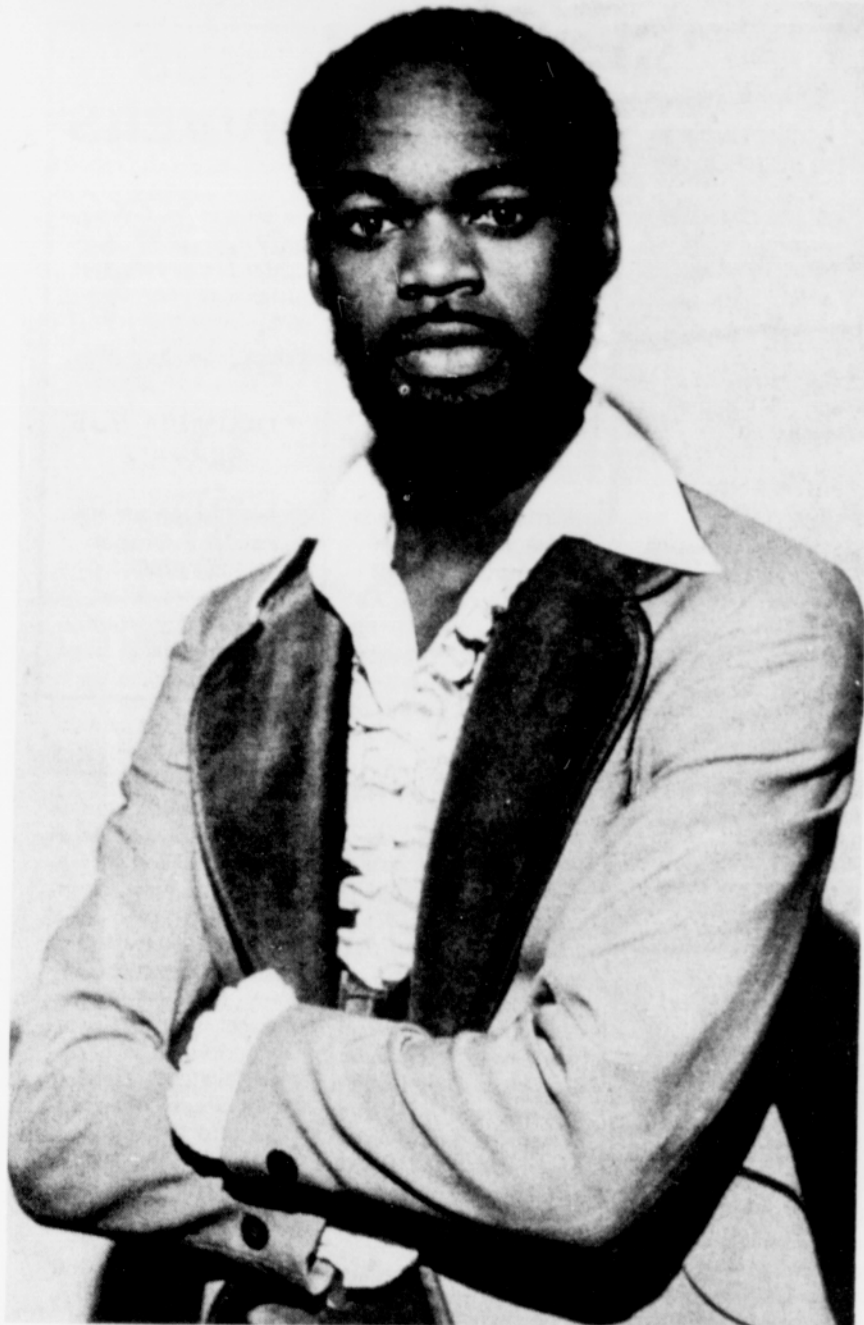

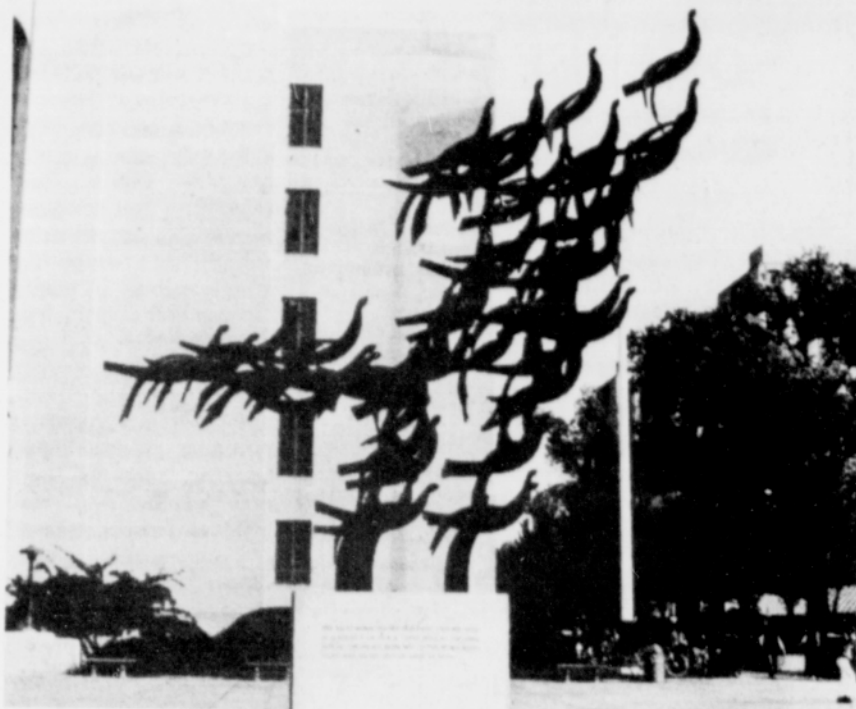

FOUR EMOTIONS

"Four Emotions," a portfolio of serigraphs by Erte and the introduction of his limited edition jewelry, are highlights of the exhibition opening at Pavilion Gallery, 738 S.W. Alder Street, Thursday, April 17, continuing through Sunday, April 27.

Erte depicts the emotions of love, indifference, sadness and jealousy in the new portfolio.

Presentation of "Wings of Victory," a pendant based on one of his serigraphs, marks the com-



pletion of two years of design and preparation for an extensive collection of Erte jewelry which will be available only through art galleries.

He was born Romaine de Tirtoff in St. Petersburg, Russia in 1892. When he was 19, he went to Paris and joined the fashion house of Paul Poiret. By the 1920's, Erte was the arbiter of fashion and had established with "Harper's Bazaar," creating the designs for the covers of the monthly fashion magazine.

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
