'Stress and the Black Environment' forum topic

Dr. Bobby Wright, Clinical Psychologist and Executive Director of the Garfield Park Comprehensive Community Mental Health Center located in Chicago, will keynote a one-day seminar on "Stress and the Black Environment." The Urban League Portland and the Portland Public Schools are co-sponsoring this seminar Wednesday, May 14, 1980.

A forum of Portland community members will initiate the day with a session from 9:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. at the Matt Dishman Community Center, 77 N.E. Knott. The

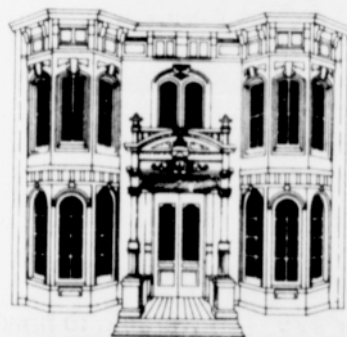
audience will have the opportunity to participate in a question and answer session after Dr. Wright's presentation. A session for Portland Public School officials will follow.

Dr. Wright has been invited to address a state-wide conference on "Violence and Oregon's Future," May 15-16, 1980 at the Wilsonville Holiday Inn. Dr. Wright's theme is "Structure, Stress and Violence." The conference is sponsored by the City of Portland Department of Public Safety and Office of Justice Planning and Evaluation in cooperation with the Criminal

Justice Planning Division of the Metropolitan Service District.

Dr. Wright has an extensive background in community, education, and clinical psychology. He has served as a consultant with federal, state, and local agencies as well as universities and colleges throughout the United States. Dr. Wright has served on the President's Commission on Mental Health-Black American's Panel and as a member of the Minority Advisory Committee to the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.
