After training at the Navy's hospital corpsman school, he served aboard the hospital ship USS HAVEN at Long Beach, CA and the Fleet Marine force Pacific, headquarted at Camp Pendleton, Oceanside, CA.

While assigned to the HAVEN, the then hospitalman Pinkard was commended for exceptional professional performance and energentic enthusiasm. Following this tour, he was assigned to the Fleet Marine Force and qualified for the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal.

After his release from active duty in 1963, Ron returned to Denver and attended the University of Colorado. After three years of pre-med, he turned to drama, moved to Los Angeles, and worked for the IRONSIDE Television series.

After his association with this series, he appeared in numerous other shows including DRAGNET 69, BRACKEN'S WORLD, ADAM 12, THE FBI, THE EDDIE CAPRA MYSTERIES, and WHITE SHADOW.

As a reserve public atfairs officer, Lt. Pinkard is assigned duties with Navy Recruiting, represents the Navy in civic ceremonies, and maintains contacts with media and professionals.
