- 1. Construction of maintenance facility, 2. Purchase of approximately 26 light rail vehicles, 3. Land acquisition, 4. Construction of track system...

The estimated cost of the project is approximately \$135,900,000. Federal participation will be approximately \$112,300,000; and the local share will be approximately \$23,600,000.
