

Calvin Toran was born in Erie, Pennsylvania on June 4, 1934. Calvin grew up in Erie, where he attended High School and also enlisted in the U.S. Navy. After his discharge he came to Portland about twelve years ago, and immediately became involved in the community affairs including the Albina Neighborhood Service Center and the Portland Metropolitan Steering Committee.

In 1968 he was employed as an administrator of the Oregon State Employment Agency in the Albina Neighborhood Office. Later he was an Assistant Administrator for the State of Oregon at the Albina Human Resource Center. Calvin was active in the Oregon Black Caucus, NAACP, Urban League and I.B.O.E. of W.

After earning his Real Estate License as a salesman, in 1972, he went to work for H.C. Plummer & Co., where he was employed until 1977.

Cal's many friends will remember him as a warm out-going person. He could be counted on to help whenever and wherever it was needed. He was proud of himself and proud of his family. At the time of his death, he was employed by Coast Janitorial Service and was a real estate salesman for E.G.

He is survived by: his wife Brenda E; his father, John Lee Torna of Hallandale, Florida; brothers, John Jr. of Portland, Eugene and Melvin of Erie, Pennsylvania, and Issac of Indianapolis, Indiana; a sister, Rosalee Toran of Erie. The funeral was held May 28th at Mount Olivet Baptist -Church, with Reverend John Jackson officiating.

The estimated cost of the project is approximately \$135,900,000. Federal participation will be approximately \$112,300,000; and the local share will be approximately \$23,600,000.

At the hearing Tri-Met will afford an opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic, and environmental aspects of the project. Interested persons may submit oral or written evidence and recommendations with respect to the project.
