

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at the Water Service Building (Auditorium), 1800 S.W. 6th Avenue, Portland, Oregon at 10:30 a.m., Monday, July 14, 1980, for the purpose of considering a project for which financial assistance is being sought from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration, pursuant to the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, generally described as follows:

Tri-Met intends to apply for a combined Section 3 (Capital) and Section 6 (Demonstration) funds to demonstrate and introduce a self-service fare collection system. The grants for analysis, staff training, equipment procurement (ticket printers, validators, and ticket vending machines), enforcement personnel, equipment maintenance personnel, and support elements required to implement the program over a four (4) year period. The self-service system of fare collection will enhance the introduction of higher capacity transit vehicles (articulated buses and LRT) and is anticipated to reduce the cost of operating the transit system in comparison with the conventional fare collection system currently in use.

No persons, families or businesses will be displaced by this project. There will be no significant impact on the environment, and the project is in conformance with and is a part of the Transportation Improvement Program of the Metropolitan Services District (METRO) and is in conformance with the comprehensive land use planning for the urban area. The project is currently under review by the A-95 Clearinghouse.

The estimated cost of the project is approximately \$8,600,000. Federal participation will be approximately \$6,200,000 and the local share will be approximately \$2,400,000.

At the hearing, Tri-Met will afford an opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic, and environmental aspects of the project. Interested persons may submit oral or written evidence and recommendations with respect to the project.

A copy of the application for a federal grant for the project, together with an analysis of the environmental impacts of the project, and the Transit Development Program, are available for public inspection at the Tri-Met office, 4012 S.E. 17th Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

The Department of Housing and Urban Development will accept Preliminary Proposals for newly-constructed housing under the Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments Program to be located in Eugene SMSA (all of Lane County).

Contract Authority in the amount of \$116,403 and a special allocation to meet the Area-wide Housing Opportunity Plan of \$271,000 are being made available to provide assistance for an estimated 92 units. The assistance to be provided for the various household types is estimated to be 18 units for large families (3 or more bedrooms) with contract authority of \$76,603; and 74 units for other families with contract authority of \$310,800.

Proposals may be submitted by private owners or Public Housing Agency (PHA) owners for direct contracting with HUD, or by PHAs on behalf of private owners with whom the PHA proposes to contract pursuant to an Annual Contributions Contract with HUD.
