

Baptists hold annual session

The Union District Baptist Association will convene with the Paradise Baptist Church 4735 N. Commercial Sunday July 13-Sunday July 20, 1980 in the celebration of its 25th Annual Session. The District Association began in 1955 under the leadership of the late Rev. Sylvester McCullum, former pastor of the Morning Star Baptist Church. In its beginning, the goal of the District Association was to bring about Christian unity and mutual counsel and cooperation among Baptist churches in an effort to proclaim the gospel of Christ. The late Rev. Sylvester McCullum was extremely instrumental in leading the District Association to achieve this goal.

The Rev. Eugene Boyd Jr., Pastor of the Providence Baptist Church, succeeded the late Rev. McCullum as Moderator of the District Association. Rev. Boyd does not view the District Association as an organization but rather, as the name states, a association of Baptist Churches, where genuine unity and fellowship exist in the union. Rev. Boyd envisions a scholarship program, funded by the churches, for minorities planning to go to school after graduation, recreation and sports activities for youth and adults, and workshops and seminars to train young men entering the

pastoral ministry.

He believes, "unless young men have a sense of history, they will lead their churches in repeating the mistakes of the past." In all, Rev. Boyd envisions the District Association continuing, as it has done in the past, to rise above local church conflicts, pettiness, childish jealousies, and greed and to strive -- as a fellowship of churches -- to make a positive impression upon the lives of individuals and the community.

Methodists elect Bishops

NEW ORLEANS -- Two new bishops were elected here during the closing sessions of the 41st Quadrennial Conference of the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church. Bishop H. H. Braskins, Bishop of the 9th Episcopal District (western U.S.) was elected president of the A.M.E. Council of Bishops.

After two days of balloting by an estimated 1,500 delegates, Rev. James Haskell Mayo of Chicago and Rev. John Hunter of Detroit were elected to the bishopric of the AME Church. Both clergymen won a majority of the votes in a highly-contested election using ballot machines. Bishops are often reassigned to head one of the AME Church's 18 districts in the U.S., the Caribbean, South America, and Africa.

Bishop Mayo, a pastor for nine years at the Coppin Memorial AME Church of Chicago, is a native of

Springfield, Ohio, and obtained his theological degree from Wilberforce University in his home state. He hosts a very popular religious program on Chicago's WNIB radio station.

A pastor at St. Stephens AME Church in Detroit for eight years, Bishop Hunter came to Detroit after 16 years as minister in Gary, Ind. Ordained at the North Ohio Annual Conference, Bishop Hunter has been a member of the AME General Conference for 24 years. He holds a master's degree from Oberlin Graduate School of Theology.

The new bishops' elections were part of a 10-day general conference of 35,000 AME members and observers. One of the meeting's major highlights was a protest march, by the bishops, who called for "one million jobs for minorities to offset the high percentage of unemployment among Blacks."

Civil Engineering - Banfield Light Rail System
