THREE YEAR HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PLAN

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The City of Portland, Office of Planning and Development, invites proposals from consultants for an analysis/assessment of the City's Housing and Community Development Block Grant Program (HCD), submitting findings and assisting in the preparation of a 3 year Housing and Community Development Plan for the period July 1981 through June 1984.

Federal HCD rules and regulations, rapidly changing economic conditions and increasing requests for HCD funding of projects necessitate a re-examination of the goals, priorities, programs and strategies of the current 3 year plan. A new plan will be submitted with Portland's 7th year (81/82) HCD annual application.

The consultant will be requested to:

1. Compile, analyze, and determine from existing data the impact five years of HCD funded activities have had on neighborhoods. This will involve examining public records and reports, provisions of the block Grant Program and local strategies. Further, affected citizen organizations, public officials and special interest groups will be interviewed to obtain a broad cross section of opinion about the HCD program. Product: interim staff report.
2. Prepare findings based on the assessment of program accomplishments and perceptions of involved persons. Such findings will relate to community needs (past and future), economic factors, component programs and their products, validity of strategies and adequacy of delivery systems. Focus on key "issues" and future policy considerations. Product: summary report for public distribution.
3. Assist the Housing & Community Development Section of OPD in preparing a draft 3 year HCD Plan through consultation, position memoranda, reviews, written drafts, and other appropriate means as requested. Product: draft plan for public distribution.

The total time span will be from August 1980, to March 1981 with parts 1 & 2 due by November 1980.

Respondants are encouraged to provide a tightly managed "team" of skills covering community planning and development, knowledge of social and economic conditions and awareness of the challenges facing HCD program decisions in the 1980's.

A selection committee shall review all responses, interview finalists and recommend to City Council their choice of consultant for the project. Responses will be judged on understanding of the project, approach, ability to meet short time lines and sensitivity to diverse public needs and concerns. Fee is not a determinant factor, however, the project is estimated to cost between \$15,000 and \$18,000.
