Sealed proposals for furnishing all material, equipment, labor and services for construction of the Sewerage Project, Phase 2, Collection System, Segments 1 and 2 for the City of Lincoln City, Oregon will be received in the City Hall, Lincoln City, Oregon until the time and date stated below.

Proposals received after the above stated time will not be considered. Immediately following the time stated above, proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud. Contracts will be awarded or bids will be rejected within seventy-five (75) days after the date of opening.

The work includes:

Schedule A - Approximately 14,600 feet of sanitary sewers and force mains ranging in diameter from 14-30 inches.

Schedule B - Pumping Stations 6 and 8.

Schedule C - Approximately 4,700 feet of sanitary sewers and force mains ranging in 6-10 inches.

Schedule D - Pumping Stations 3 and 4.

Copies of the Plans and Specifications may be obtained upon application at the Portland office of STRAAM Engineers upon payment of a deposit of \$75.00; the deposit will be refunded upon return of the documents in good condition within 15 days after opening of bids. If the Plans or Specifications are damaged so as to preclude their further use, or if they are not returned within the 15-day period, the entire deposit will be retained.

A pre-bid conference will be held in Lincoln City approximately two weeks prior to the bid opening. The conference will include a visit to each of the four pumping station sites included in Schedules B and D. The bidder shall satisfy himself as to the existing condition of the pumping stations and the extent of the modifications as required. Contact the city or the engineers for the exact time and place.

All proposals must be submitted on the regular proposal forms and must be accompanied by a certified check, cash or bid bond in an amount equal to at least 5 percent of the total basic bid. A corporate surety bond in the full amount of the Contract will be required for the successful bidder to guarantee faithful performance.

Bidders may submit proposals for one or more of the schedules of work. However, each schedule will be considered separately and bidders may not condition any proposal on being awarded any other schedule of work. If a bidder conditions his bid, such condition shall be of no effect and the owner may reject the conditioned proposal.

Bidders shall note the requirements of Environmental Protection Agency. Proposals must be accompanied by the completed and signed forms as stipulated in the specifications section titled "EPA Specifications Insert." Any contract or contracts awarded under this Advertisement for Bids are expected to be funded in part by a grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Neither the United States nor any of its departments, agencies or employees is or will be a party to this Advertisement for Bids or any resulting contract. This procurement will be subject to regulations contained in 40 CFR 35.936, and 35.939.

Attention to the bidders is particularly called to the requirements as to conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under the Contract.

The attention of the bidders and equipment suppliers is also directed to the pre-bid approval requirements of Section 01100, Paragraph 1.18, MAJOR EQUIPMENT APPROVAL, of the specifications.

The City of Lincoln City reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive informalities.

Bids may not be withdrawn for a period of 75 days following the time when bids are submitted.

INVITATION TO BID

Sealed Proposals for the construction of Bend Sewage Collection and Treatment Facilities, Contract No. 16, McGrath Road and Sludge Disposal Area, and Contract No. 30, Landscaping, addressed to the Recorder-Treasurer, City of Bend, Oregon, will be received at the office of the Recorder-Treasurer, City Hall, Bend, Oregon, until 10:00 a.m., local time on the 15th day of September, 1980 and then will be publicly opened and read in the City Commission Room, 720 Wall Street, Bend, Oregon.

The work contemplated for Contract No. 16 consists of clearing, grubbing, grading, base preparation and paving of a 1.2 mile section of McGrath Road, located approximately one mile north of the Bend Municipal Airport, Deschutes County, Oregon. Additional work will consist of construction of approximately six miles of barbed wire fence and rough grading approximately eight miles of road.

The work contemplated for Contract No. 30 consists of landscaping approximately 10 acres at a wastewater treatment plant and several pump stations. Work will include providing all trees, shrubs, grass, topsoil, and miscellaneous landscaping materials in addition to an underground sprinkler system.

Plans and Specifications may be reviewed at the office of the Engineer, Bend Engineering Consultants (BECON), 61360-5 South Highway 97, Bend, Oregon, phone (503) 382-4114. A copy of the documents may be obtained at the office of the Engineer upon receipt of \$30 for each Document. No refunds will be made.

Before a Contract will be awarded for the work contemplated herein, the Owner will conduct such investigation as is necessary to determine the performance record and ability of the apparent low Bidder to perform the size and type of work specified under this Contract. Upon request, the Bidder shall submit such information as deemed necessary by the Owner to evaluate the Bidder's qualifications.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond executed on the prescribed form, payable to the City of Bend, Oregon, in an amount not less than 10 percent of the amount bid.

The successful Bidder will be required to furnish the necessary additional bonds(s) for the faithful performance of the Contract, as prescribed in the Contract Documents.

Bidders on this project will be required to comply with the provisions of the President's Executive Order No. 11246 and requirements issued thereunder. The requirements for Bidders and Contractors under this Order are specified in the Contract Documents.

The Bidder's attention is directed to the provisions of these Documents that relate to the utilization of minority business enterprises during the performance period of the Contract. The Environmental Protection Agency Region X has adopted the following goals for this Contract:

- Ten to fifteen percent of construction work (on a dollar basis) shall be performed by minority subcontractors.

- Ten to fifteen percent of construction supplies and materials shall be procured from minority-owned suppliers.

Prior to award of a Contract, EPA will review the proposals with respect to the bidder's degree of compliance with the above goals; a low bidder who has not achieved these goals must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Director, Office of Civil Rights and Urban Affairs, EPA Region X, that the goals are not attainable on the Contract work.

The attention of Bidders is directed to the federal and state government requirements and conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under the contract.

Any contract awarded under this INVITATION TO BID is expected to be funded in part by a grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Neither the United States nor any of its departments, agencies, or employees is or will be a party to this INVITATION TO BID or any resulting Contract.

Before a contract will be awarded, compliance with all EPA requirements specified in the Contract Documents will be subject to EPA review and approval.

The Owner reserves the right to reject all Proposals or any Proposals not conforming to the intent and purpose of the Contract Documents, and to postpone the award of the Contract for a period of time which, however, shall not extend beyond 60 days from the bid opening date.

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed proposals for the construction of Old Town Street and Storm Sewer Improvements (Community Development Block Grant Project No. 1036) within the City of Sherwood, Oregon, will be received at the office of Tad Milburn, City Administrator, City of Sherwood, 90 N.W. Park Street, Sherwood, Oregon 97140 until 10:00 a.m. Pacific Standard Time, on the 9th day of September, 1980, and then will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The work contemplated consists of schedules of the proposal as follows:

SCHEDULE I - Street Improvements - Construction consists of 1,280 cubic yards of excavation, 2,259 linear feet of concrete curb construction, 3,162 square yards of two- (2) inch compacted thickness of Class C asphalt concrete pavement on base rock, 135 square yards of one and one-half (1-1/2) inches compacted thickness of Class C asphalt concrete overlay, eleven (11) catch basins, 270 linear feet of storm sewer lateral construction, 200 square feet of sidewalk construction, and other miscellaneous construction items.

SCHEDULE II - Storm Sewer Improvements - Construction consists of 1,146 linear feet of eighteen (18) inch concrete sewer pipe, thirty-six (36) linear feet of fifteen (15) inch concrete sewer pipe, 747.5 linear feet of twelve (12) inch concrete sewer pipe, eight (8) standard manholes, one (1) ditch inlet, one (1) outfall structure with rip rap, and pavement restoration.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Performance and Payment Bond for faithful performance of the Contract in the full amount of the Contract price.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than the minimum salaries and wages as set forth in the Contract Documents must be paid on this project in accordance with ORS 279.350, and that the Contractor must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder; the City of Sherwood reserves the right to reject any or all proposals. The City of Sherwood also reserves the right to postpone award of the Contract for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from date of bid opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and to accept that proposal which is to the best interests of the City of Sherwood.

Failure to submit prequalification forms ten (10) days in advance will result in automatic disqualification of the bidder. The Engineer shall notify all noneligible bidders seven (7) days before bid opening.
