## African photos on exhibit

An exhibition of photographs, titled "East Africa -- Photo Safari," will be at the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry Sept. 5 through Oct. 6. The exhibition will consist of some 50 color and Black-and-white photographs featuring the peoples and wildlife of East Africa.

The work of Lynda Falkenstein, the photographs were shot during the fall of 1979 in Kenya, Tanzania and the Seychelles Islands, which lie 1,000 miles off the coast of Africa in the Indian Ocean.

"The show isn't an African travelogue," says photographer Falkenstein. "I haven't tried to represent Africa from A to Z; what I have done, I hope, is to capture something of the essence of the East African experience." Subject matter ranges from colorfully robed Masai and Samburu tribesmen to lions, cheetahs and leopard caught cavoring, or just relaxing, in the wild.

Falkenstein, who received her Ph.D from Stanford University, is an associate professor of education at Portland State University. For several years, she has combined a busy academic career with photography. Having long entertained a special affection for Africa, she plans to return there soon after the show to make additions to her already impressive photographic profile of the continent.

The photo show will be on display in OMSI's east exhibit hall. There will be an additional charge for viewing the exhibition, after the regular Museum admission.

#### General Instructions to Parents IMPORTANT

1. Site registration will begin at 9:00 A.M.
2. Site will be open until 6:00 P.M.
3. Wherever possible please keep children at home
4. Use the Parent Buddy System - ask other parents - relatives - or friends who will be at home during the day to keep your children.
